



WCCCD intern students are engaged in a research course on the campus of Michigan Technological University. They are learning how to conduct thorough and in-depth research.






















Online accessibility and guidance is key to the success of our students in the GED program located at the Little Rock Urban Institute.





The General Accounting Department is conducting its fiscal year-end close process. The department is meeting frequently in order to close out fiscal year 2018. Below are the closing steps to direct their tasks:

- •Complete the posting procedures and the closing procedures for all modules.
- ·Post the final adjusting entries in General Ledger.
- Print an account list to verify the posting type of each account.
- ·Close the last period of the fiscal year.
- Perform file maintenance on the Financial series group of modules.
- •Verify the settings in the General Ledger Setup window.
- Make a backup
- Print a final Detailed Trial Balance report.
- •Print the year-end financial statements.
- ·Set up a new fiscal year.
- Close the fiscal year.
- Close all the fiscal periods.
- Adjust the budget figures for the new year, and then print the financial statements
- ·Make a backup.







Students shared their talent and experiences about various songs.




