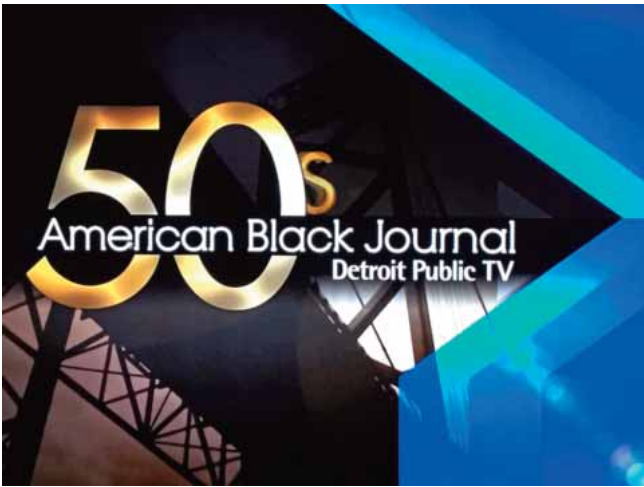

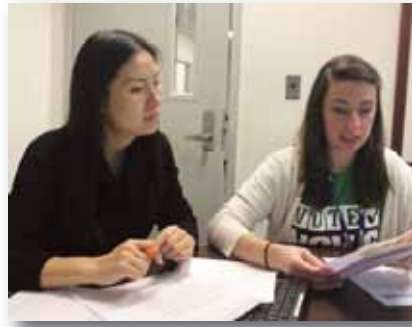
New Podcast Available on the District's Website!

Faculty Evaluation Process Refresher Training

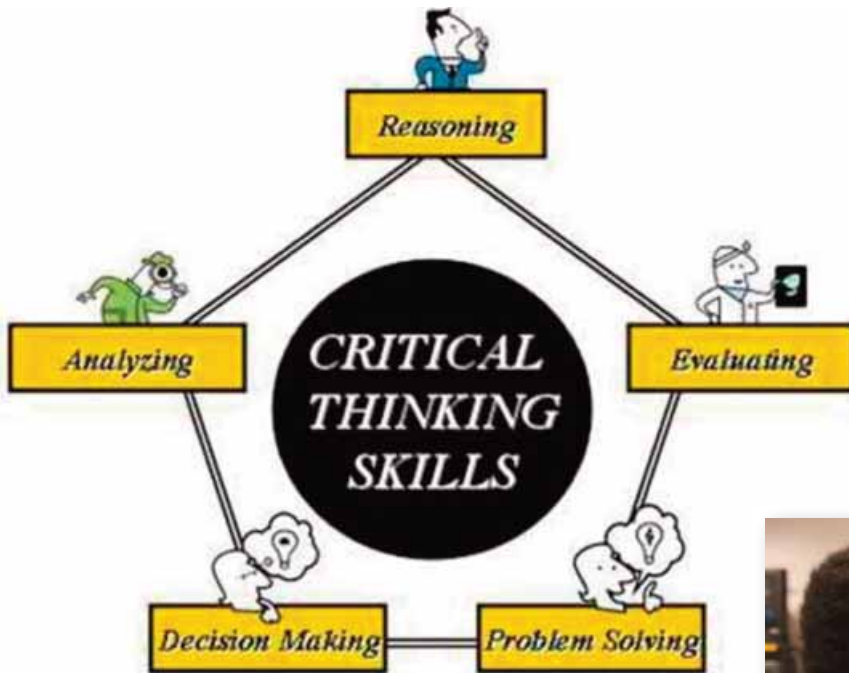

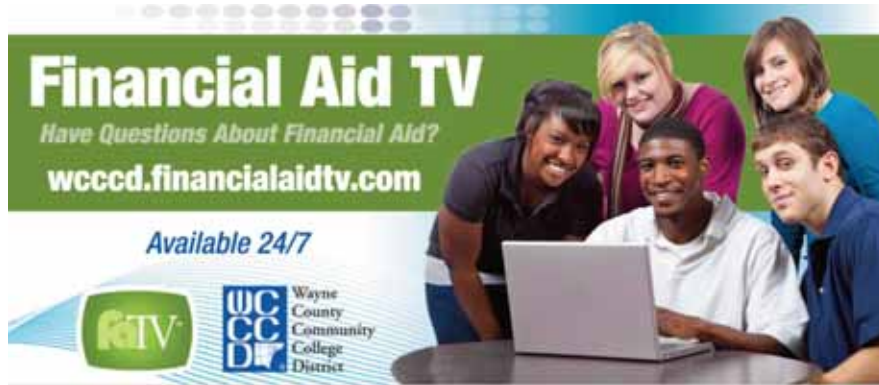


On the Move...

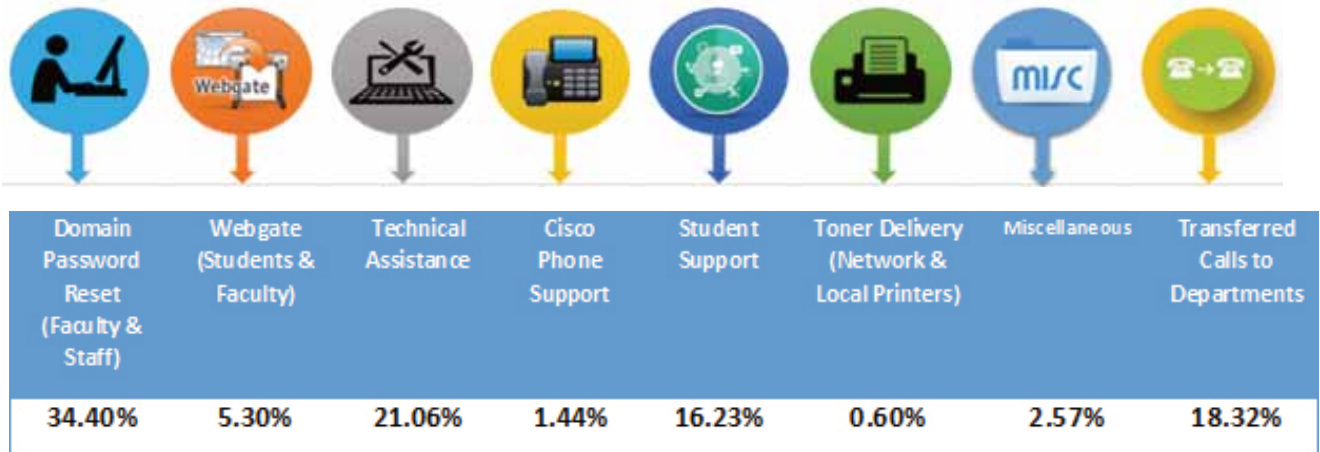
The team met with representatives from the District Police Authority and Infinite Technology to finalize the Camera Expansion Project at the Northwest Campus.

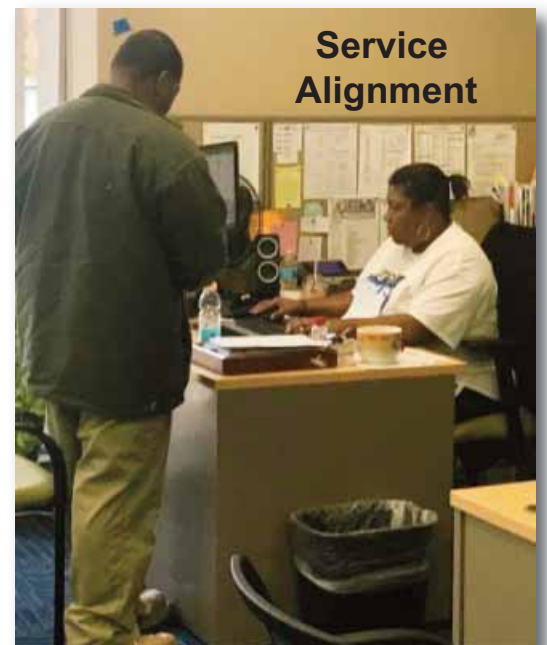
The Northwest Campus continues to align operational efficiencies within all service areas. Student self-services as well as admissions and registration have aligned their services to better accommodate students.

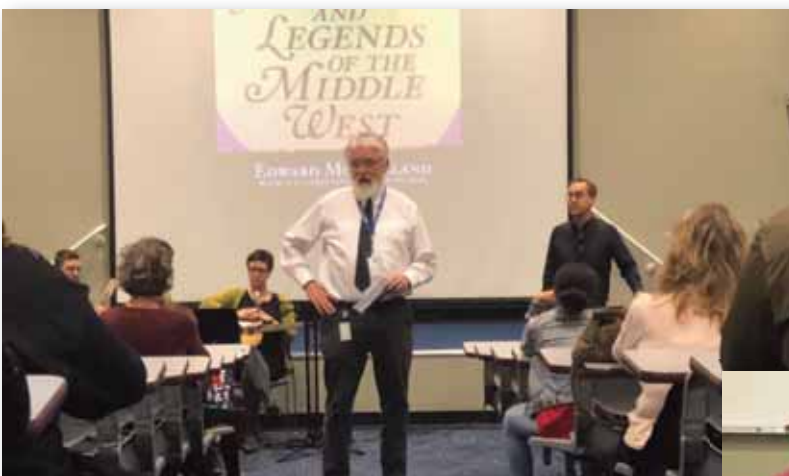

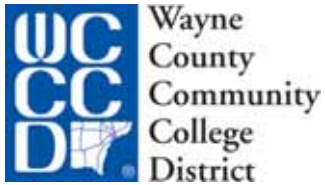


Community Partnerships
