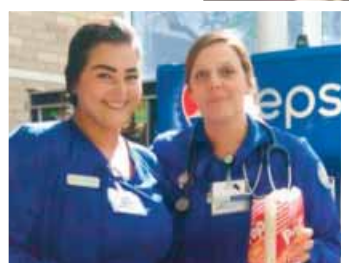

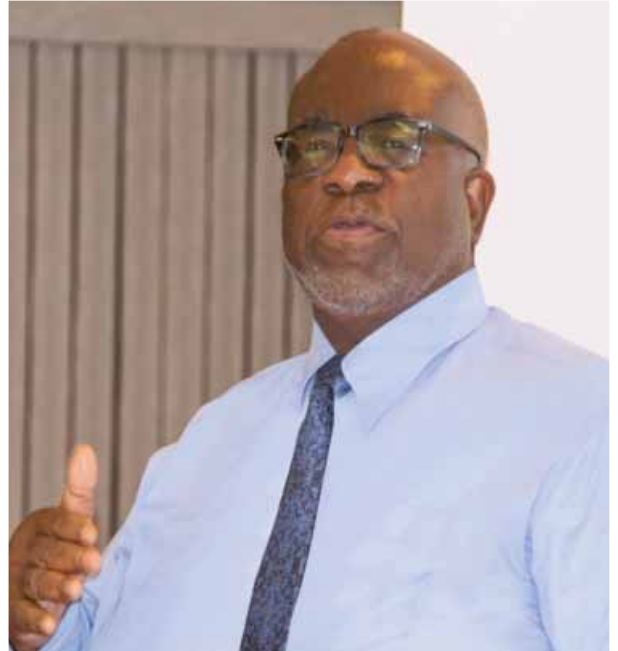

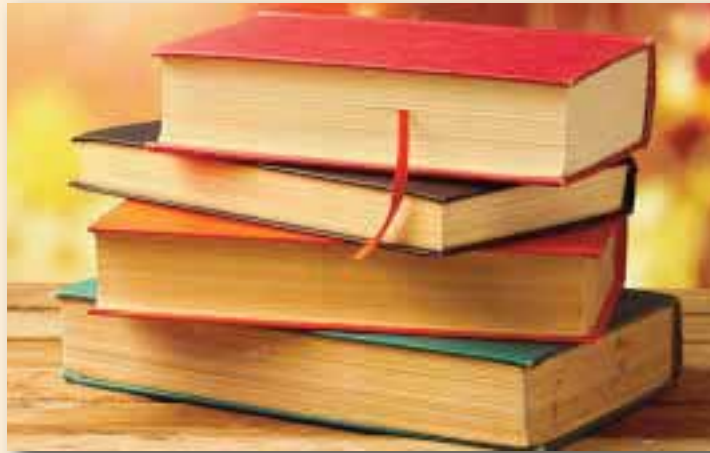
Career Spotlight: Paralegal Technology

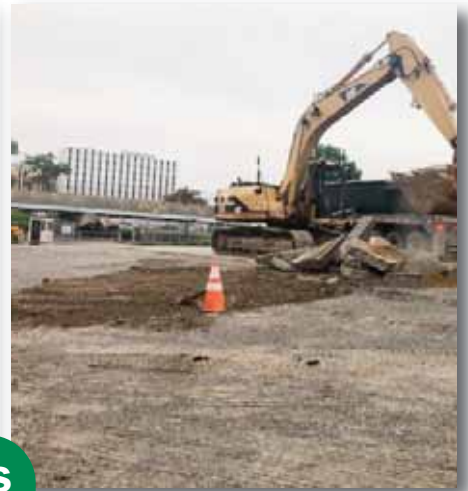

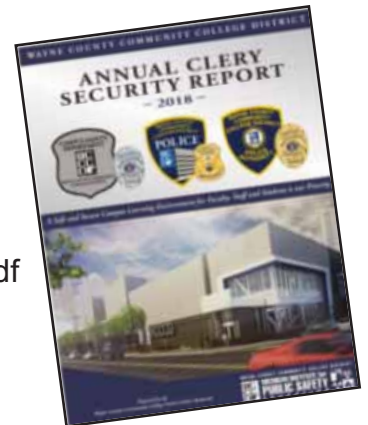
District Police Authority

District-wide Software Asset Management Update

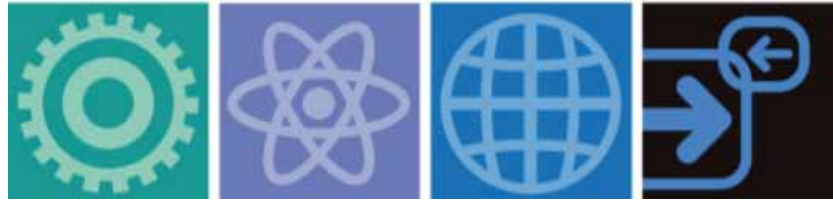

Intercultural Conversations

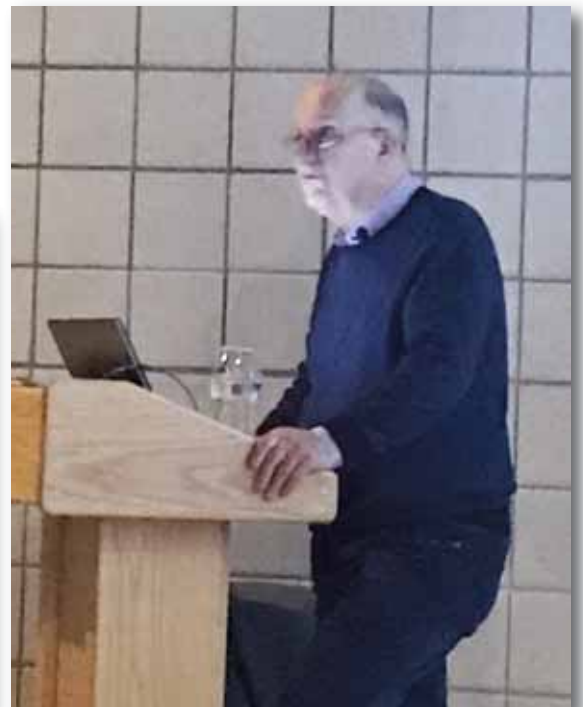

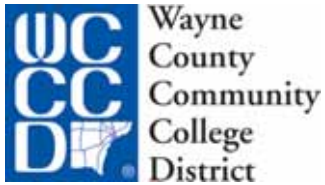
