














Student Support and Engagement




Recruitment and Outreach



The Outreach Team participated in the 39th Annual Detroit Jazz Festival and provided information on WCCCD academic and career programs.








Excitement is in the air, as the 2018-2019 school year begins and the Recruitment Team is contacting school counselors to set up on-site admission opportunities for the class of 2019.



STEM Program: University Partnerships






The Wayne County Sheriff's Department held their Special Response Team Training. Participants acted out scenarios on the training grounds to conduct compliant and high risk felony building entries.




