


Banner 9 Upgrade Project Weekly Update




The end users will approve their modules in test environment after the completion of the Banner 9 navigation and orientation.


The Division of Administration and Finance has successfully automated the generation of the Financial Statements with the click of a button!




Zeta Phi Beta Sorority
