As part of the District-wide initiative to re-engineer and secure data closets, the Division of Information Technology is working with the selected vendors to complete the upgrade and renovation project:


- 70% of the renovation completed in preparation for the construction of the main data closet



Introduce Social Annotation as a Means to Engage


Hypothesis: a social annotating tool that takes these reading practices to a whole



Instructors were provided the latest processes and procedures.




















Michigan Institute for Public Safety Education

Boy Scouts of America Merit Badge Mania


