### Transfer Courses and Agreements

We have three different type of transfer options with four-year schools. When followed, these plans ensure a seamless transfer process.

**Articulation Agreements** - These plans provide for the transfer of an entire prescribed program of study.

**Transfer Agreements** - These plans are guides for courses to be taken at WCCCD before transfer.

**Transfer Course Equivalencies** - Aligns courses with those at the four- year school.

**MTA** - The Michigan Transfer agreement (MTA) is a statewide agreement that provides for the transfer of 30 semester credits to meet many (and in some cases all) of the General education requirements at participating Michigan four-year colleges and universities.



### Learning Resource Center

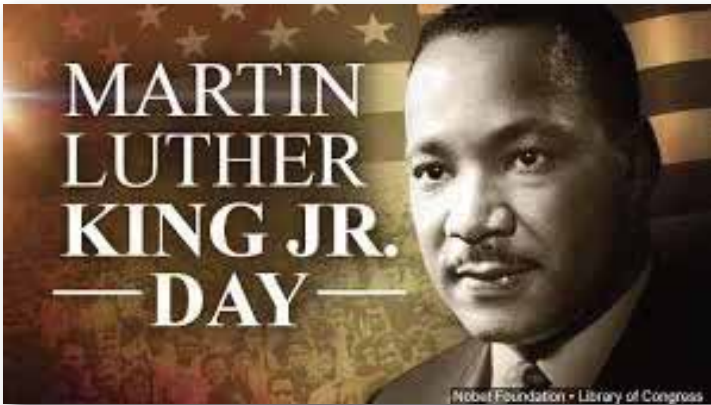
Students can access the Learning Express Library through the LRC website. Students are able to use the College Center to strengthen academic skills such as reading, grammar and writing, math, and science. The College Center also prepares students for placement tests and entrance exams.

### How to Request an Instructor's Copy of a Textbook

WCCCD ensures that faculty have the tools they need to provide a high quality instructional experience for our students, the most significant of which is textbook. This is the process that faculty follow in order to obtain a textbook.

- The request may be sent directly from an instructor to the Division of Educational Affairs or through the Campus President's Office.
- Once received, a confirmation email is sent to the requestor.
- The Educational Affairs representative confirms instructor assignment.
- Once confirmed, the request is sent to the Purchasing Department.
- The textbook is ordered through the Purchasing Department.
- The hard copy textbook is shipped directly to Instructor's home address and digital copy to their email.
- In certain cases, the book may need to be purchased and picked up at the campus bookstore.

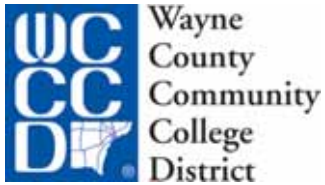


## Intercultural Conversations
