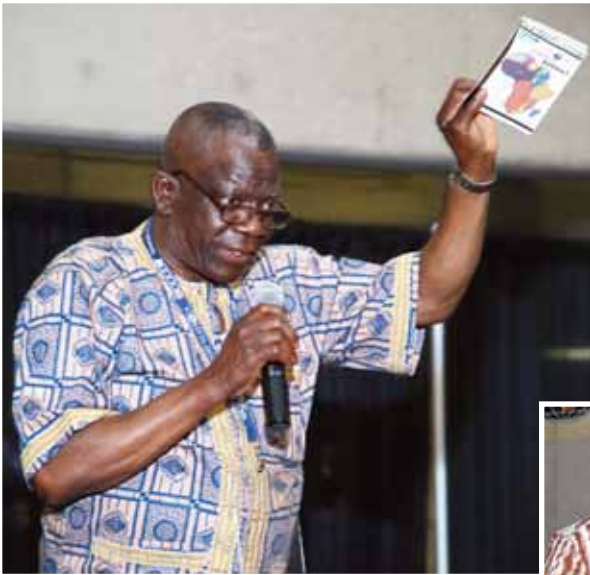

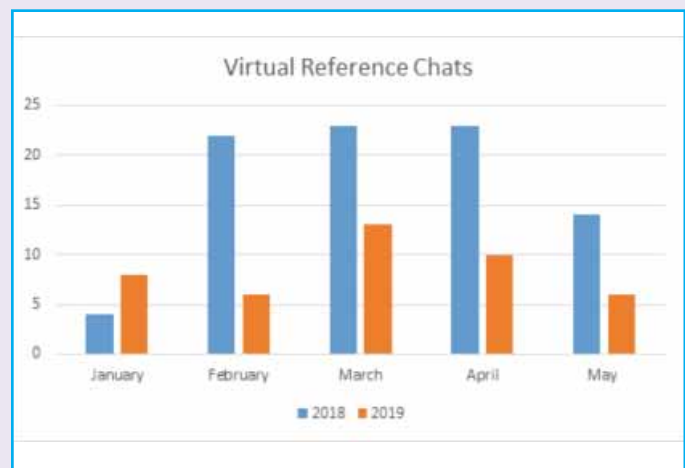

HR Dashboard: FMLA Compliance

The Division of Human Resources fully recognizes the importance of being in compliance with the Federal Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA). The District provides family/medical leave to eligible employees requiring unpaid time off for qualified medical and family reasons. The District works with a FMLA source, third-party administrator, to ensure all leaves are FMLA compliant.

The following is the eligibility criteria for FMLA:

- The birth of a child; child adoption; or foster care
- To care for the employee's spouse, child, or parent who has a serious health condition
- A serious health condition that makes the employee unable to perform the essential functions of his or her job; and
- Any qualifying emergencies.

The following presents information and government data on STEM occupations in the U.S. as well as WCCCD STEM graduate demographics.

STEM occupations grew 79% since 1990, outpacing overall U.S. job growth.

Michigan is among the states with the highest STEM employment.

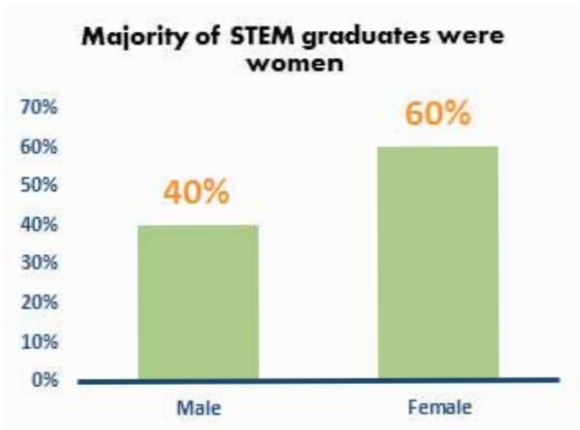
STEM graduates working in STEM occupations earn \$11,000 more annually on average

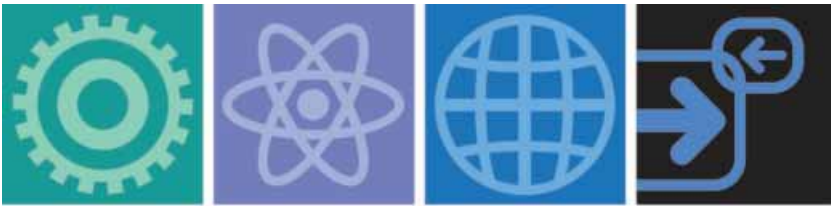

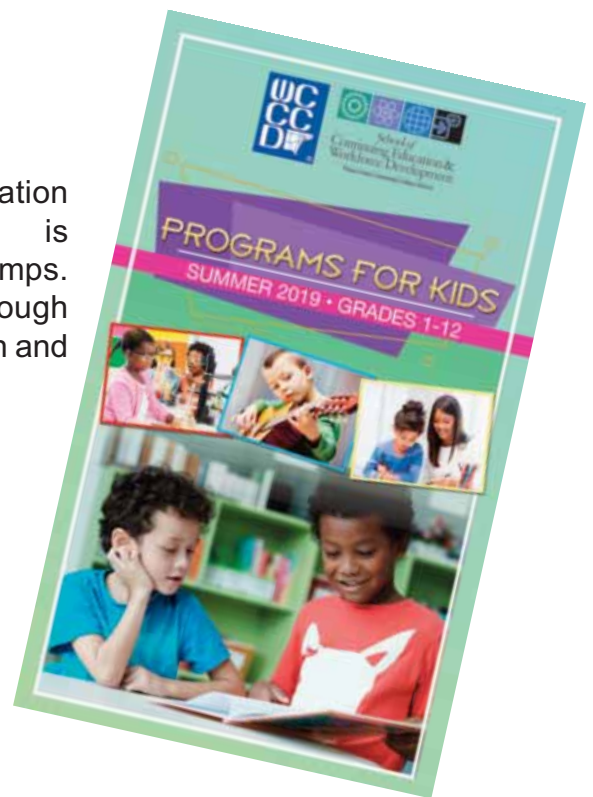

The School of Continuing Education and Workforce Development is preparing for the 2019 Kids' Camps. Summer interns have gone through training to ensure quality instruction and programming.

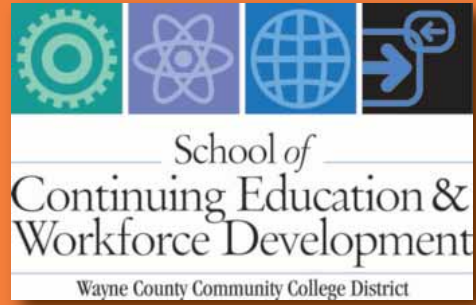


SMART Program Recruitment Efforts

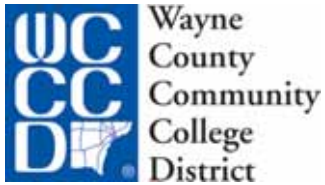
