The Learning Classroom: Encourage Effective Collaboration

Faculty in any discipline can use these tools to 'actively engage' students.



- **Small Group Discussions**– These discussions help students understand and retain material, while also serving the broader goals of developing their communication skills and increasing their awareness of their classmates as learning resources.
- **Peer Instruction Exercises**– One-minute paper reflections or speed problem solving questions, paired with peer to peer discussion, can be a very effective teaching strategy. Upon completion of the question and at least one iteration, tally the answers.

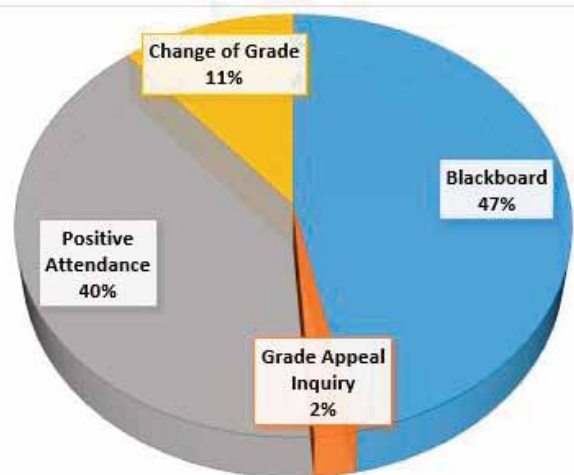

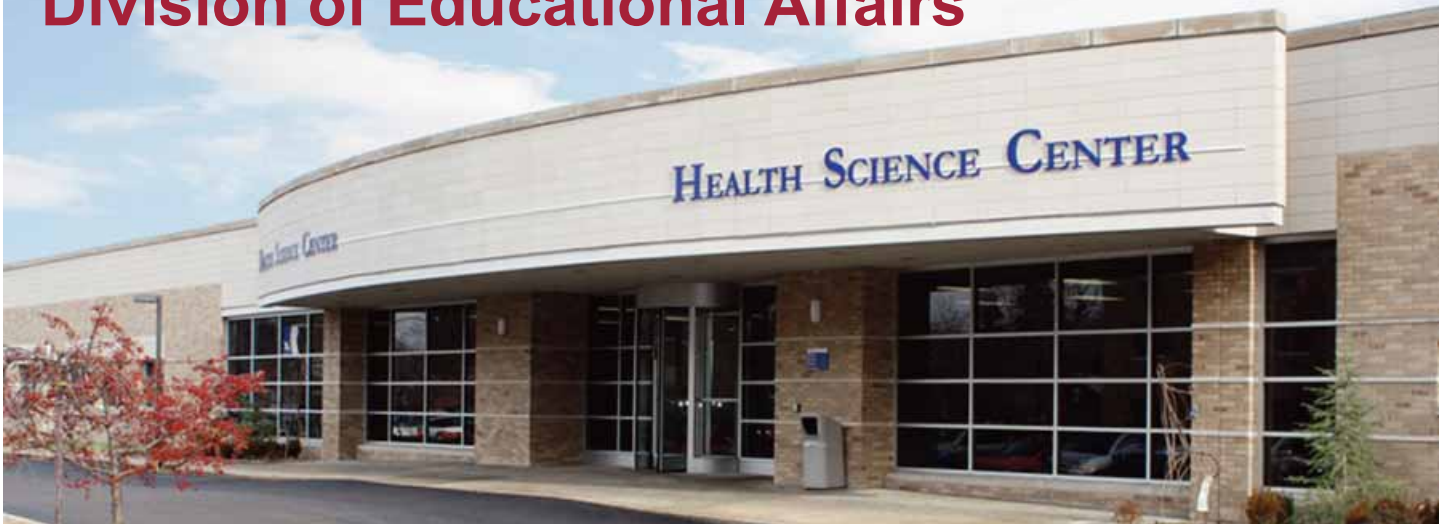

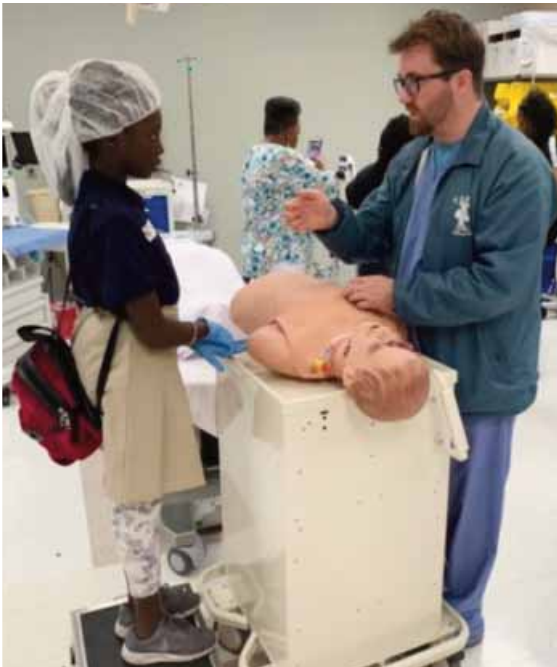


Detroit Job Corps Tour

Members of the General Accounting and Bursar's team met to discuss important assignments related to the 2018-2019 fiscal year-end close.

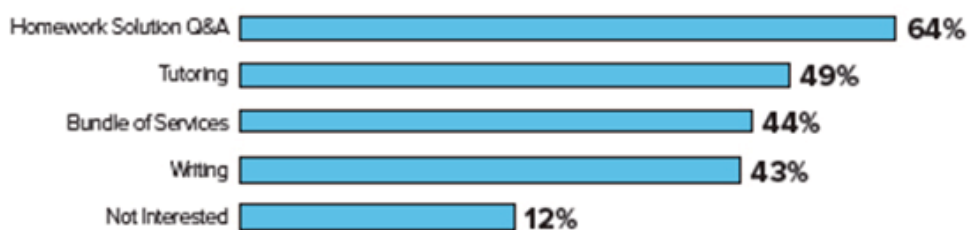

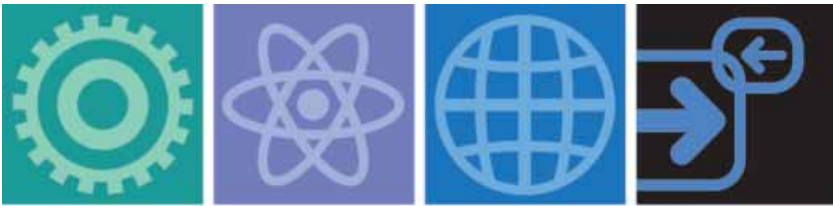

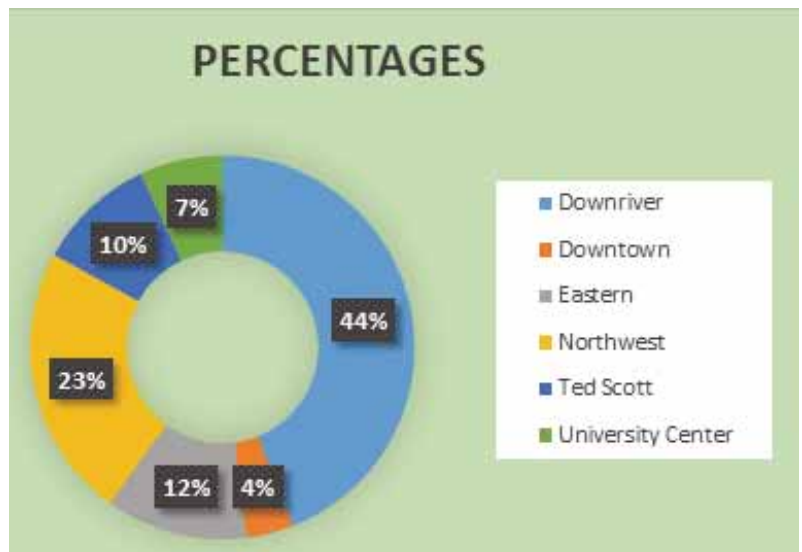

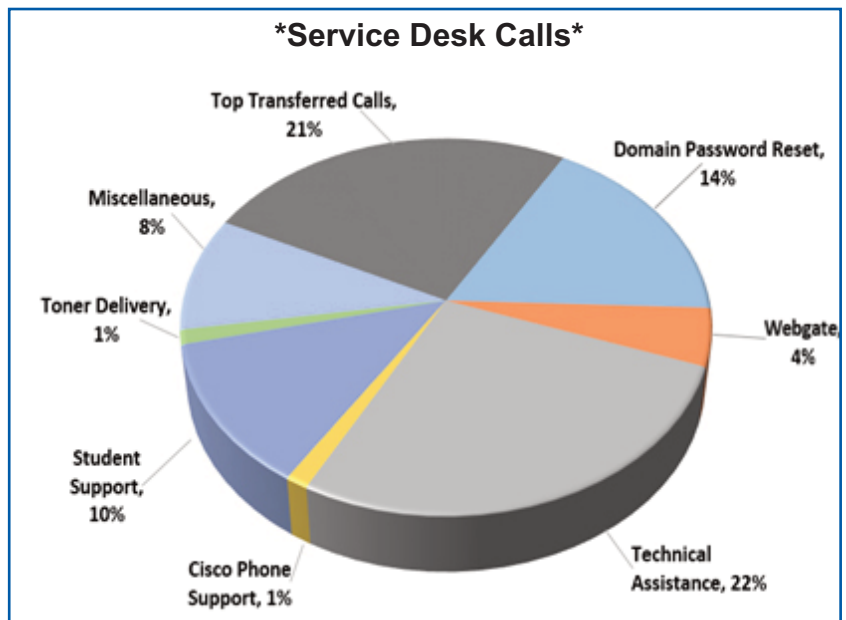

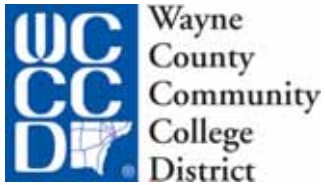
“Safe in the Streets” Summit
