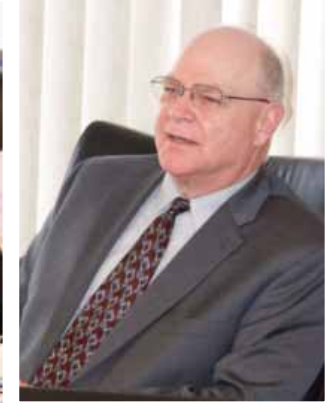

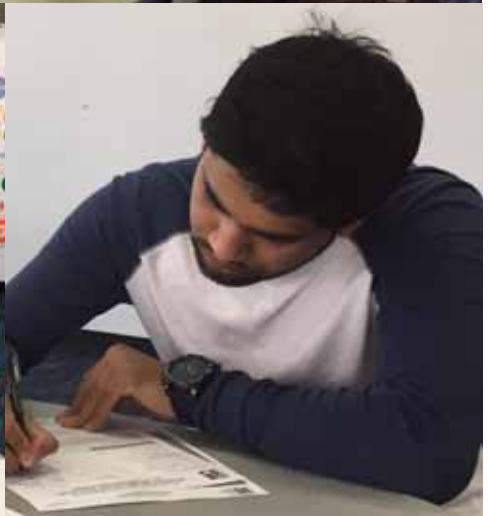
## Division of Student Services Functions

Practical Nursing Education courses support the Licensed Practical Nursing (LPN) college certificate degree program, one of the newest program offerings at the District. LPNs generally work under the supervision of registered nurses and care for the ill, injured, convalescent and disabled functioning as practical nurses in diverse-care settings.

According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, a career as an LPN has an expected growth rate of around 19% by 2022, which is faster than the projected growth rate of most industries and offers many opportunities to pursue different paths and advancement options.

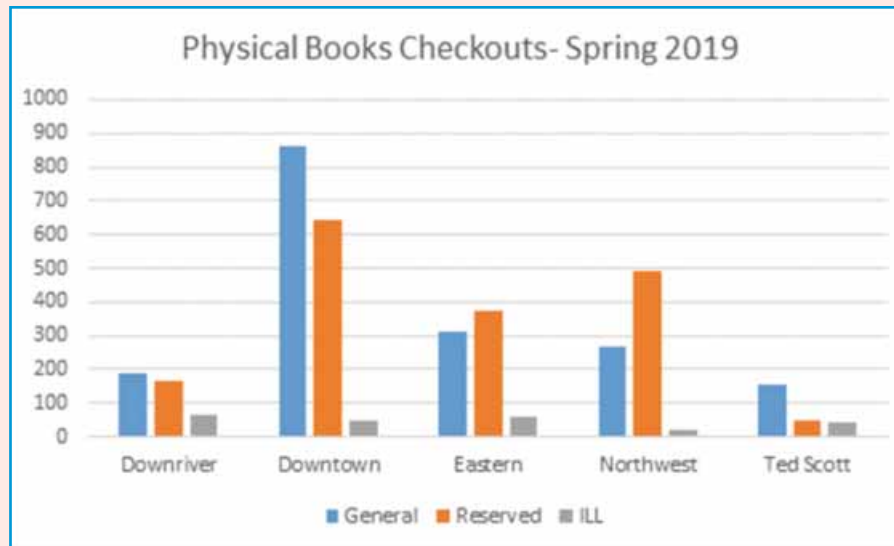

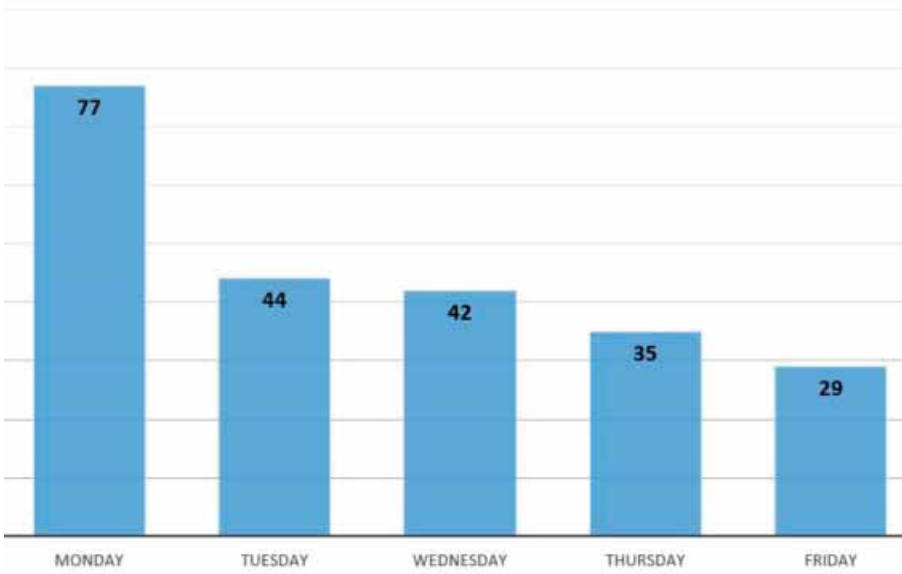

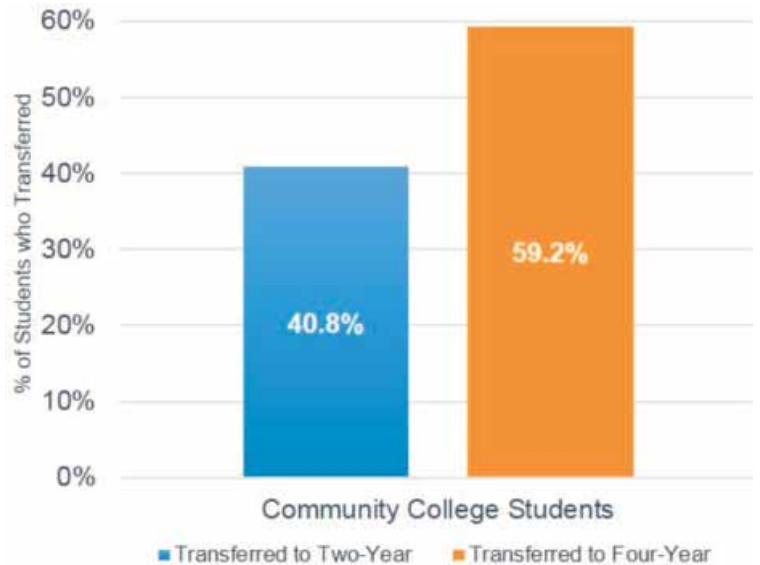

## What's Trending in IE: Transfer Patterns to four-year Universities

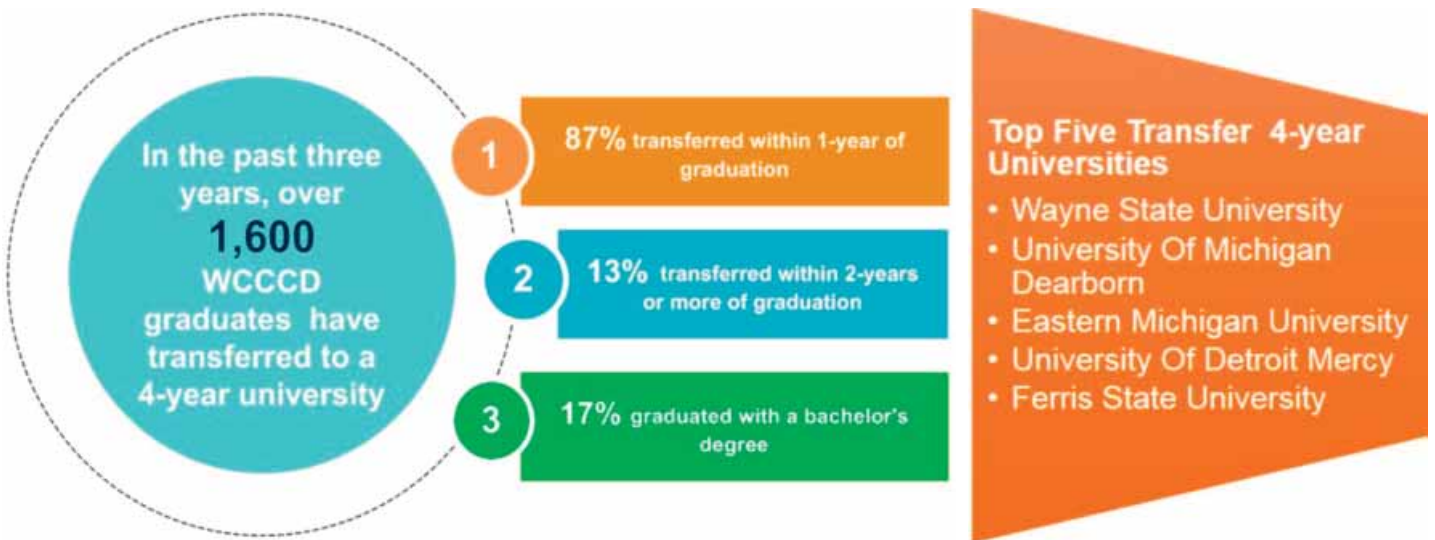
The Division of Institutional Effectiveness (IE) evaluates our graduate outcomes using National Student Clearinghouse data to track, analyze, and report institutional student success outcomes such as transfer rates. According to the National Student Clearinghouse Research Center, of all national students who transferred from a two-year institution, 59.2 percent transferred to a four-year institution.

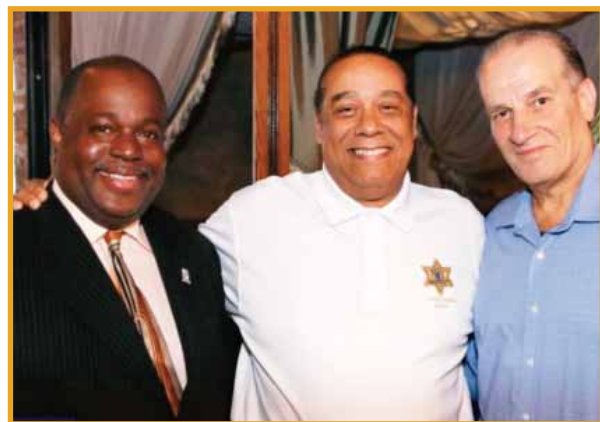

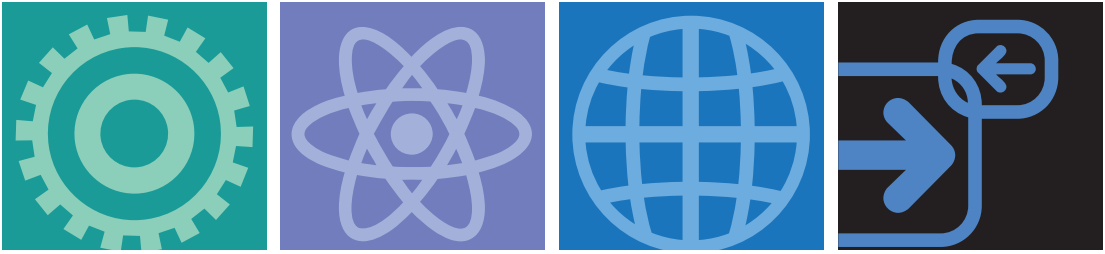

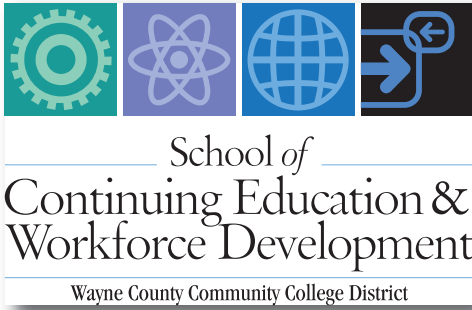
## Grosse Pointe Public Schools Professional Development Workshop

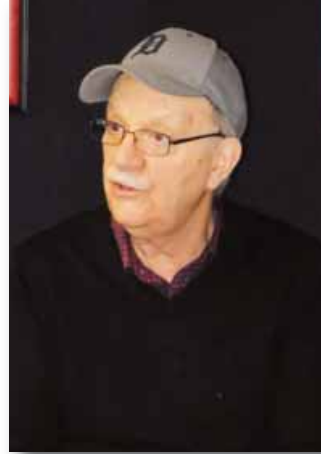

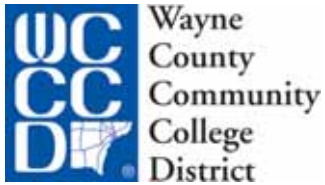
