



According to Applied Education Systems, Career and Technical Education (CTE) has become a major pillar of the American education system over the past several years. CTE is a nationwide phenomenon that does everything from increasing high school graduation rates to boosting the overall U.S. economy. Other facts about CTE:

- Between 2012 and 2022, there will be more than 50 million job openings
- 27% of people with an associate's degree or less out-earn those with a bachelor's degree
- Technical and applied science graduates earn \$2,000 to \$11,000 more per year than those with a bachelor's degree

WCCCD offers more than 130 degree and certificate programs.

WCCCD students have ongoing access to library services, through a partnership with the Detroit Public Library (DPL). Sunday library service is provided at three locations (Main Library, Redford, and Wilder branches), October- May from 1:00-5:00 p.m.

Students who are Detroit residents are encouraged to apply for a DPL, which allows for materials to be checked out and Internet access. Students who are non-Detroit residents, and have a valid card from a MILibraryCard member library, may also borrow materials from all DPL locations.

With 22 convenient library locations throughout Detroit, WCCCD students have access to:

The team also conducted the weekly status update meeting to keep track of project progress, decide any changes if any, as well as produce a schedule for the upcoming weeks.













The enrollment represents activity for the week of May 20 - 25, 2019




