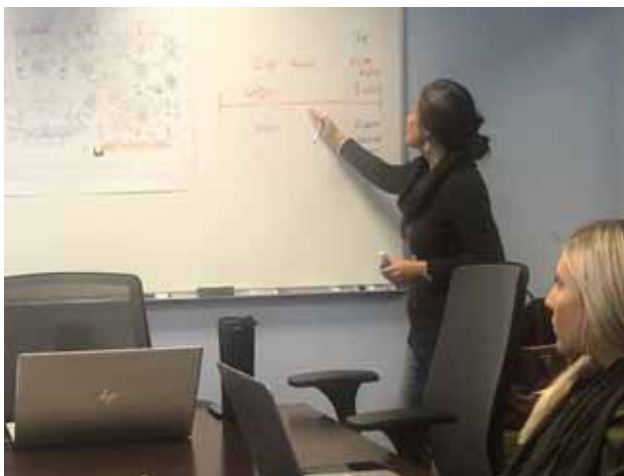
The overall ECCA project will be conducted over three years and will train 16,000 apprentices. WCCCD is 1 of 4 Michigan community colleges to receive a grant award.

This grant will increase educational attainment and connect students to apprenticeships and career pathway opportunities within the skilled trades.

The grant will boost the education attainment of WCCCD students helping FCA's strategy to qualify residents for many of the 5,000 new jobs that will be created for the new Detroit Plant.

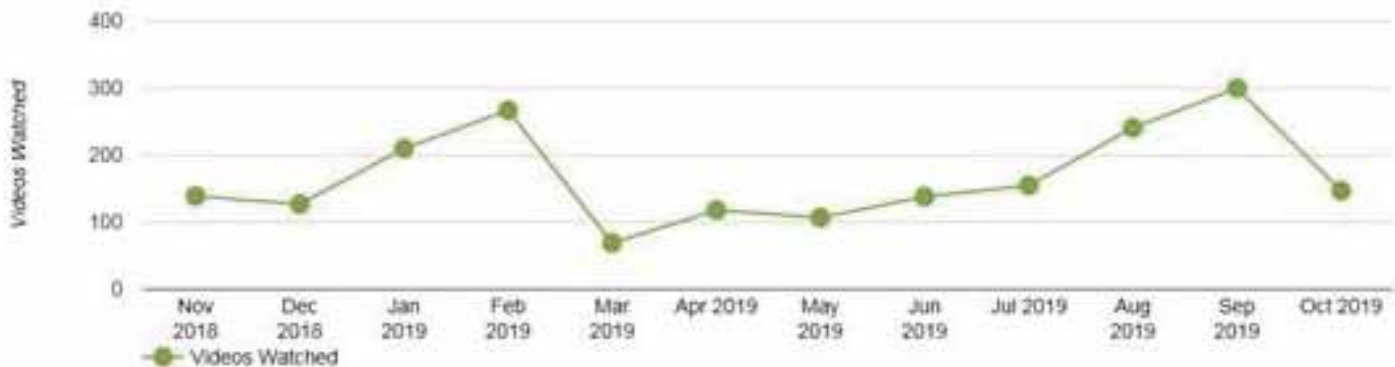

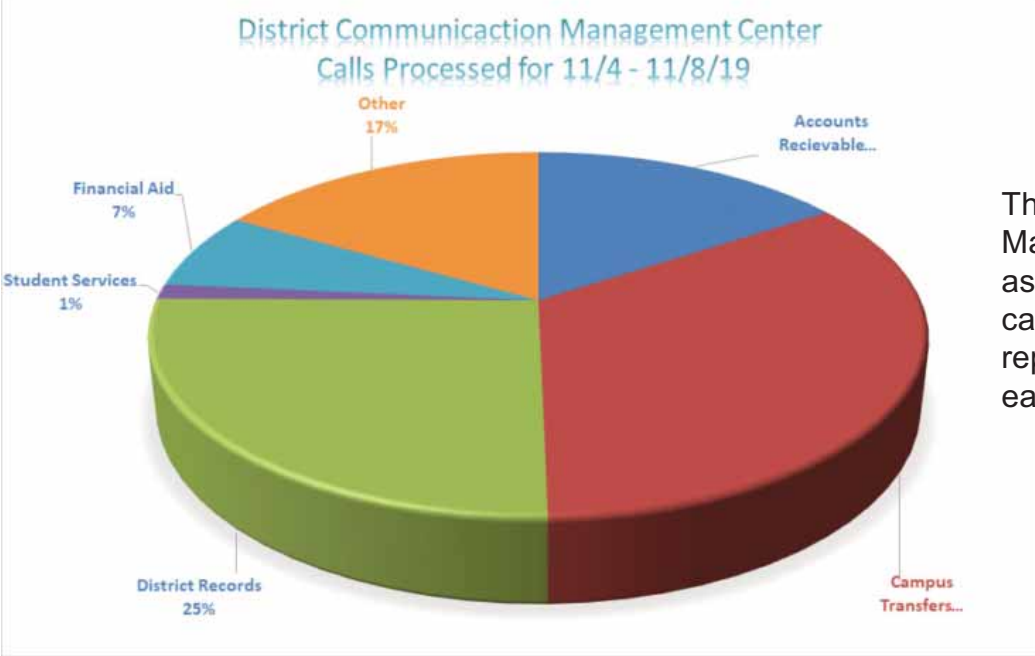

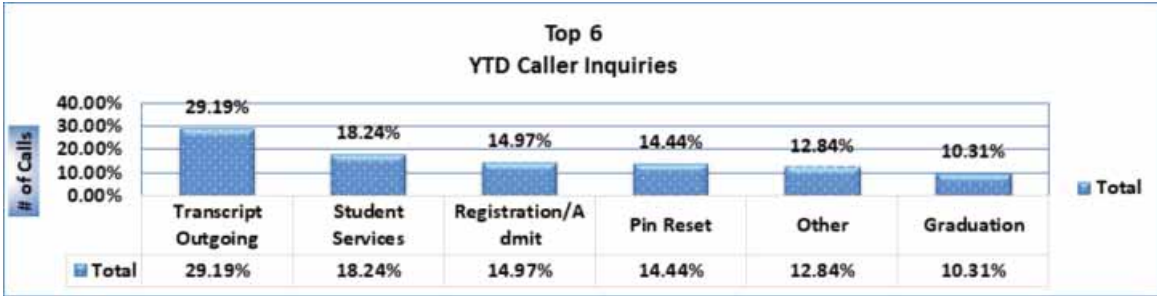


The Division of Student Services hosted an academic advisory update with Ferris State University on the transfer process.

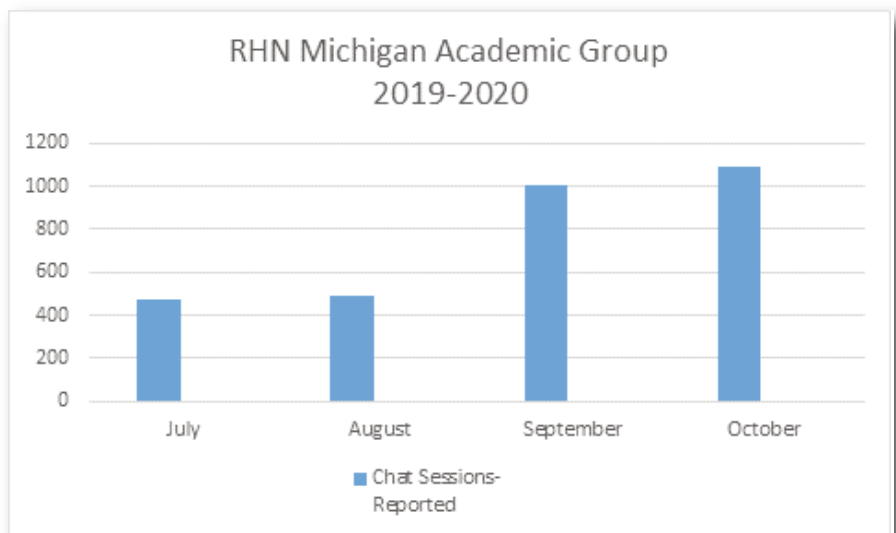
Transfer Programs

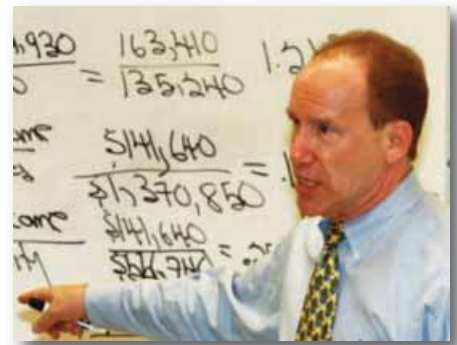

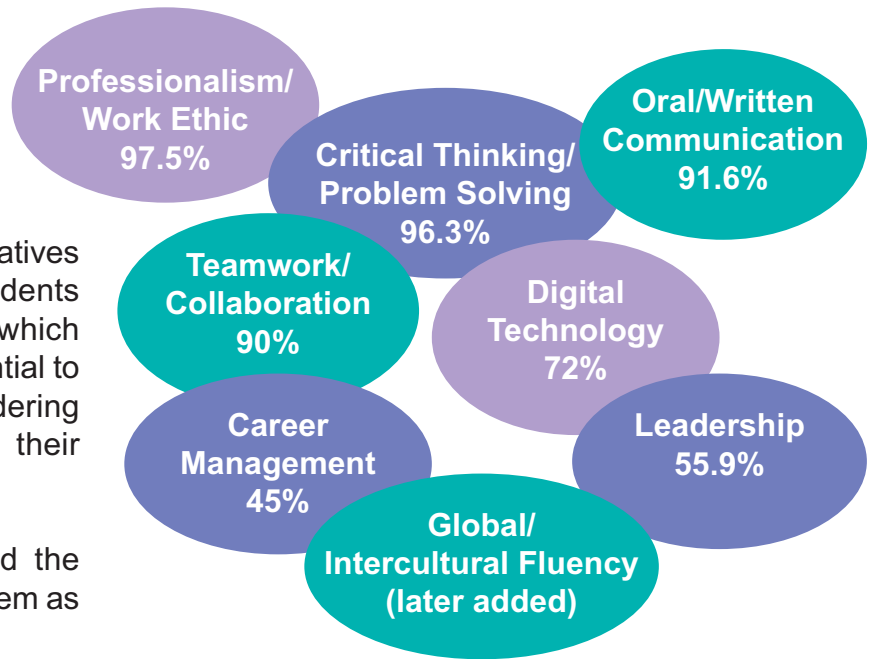


Are we preparing students with career readiness competencies?

The Division of Institutional Effectiveness (IE) reviews local and national data to assist the District with improving programs and services offered to students. The National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE), through a task force of college career services and human resource professionals, and based on extensive research among employers, identified eight competencies associated with career readiness.

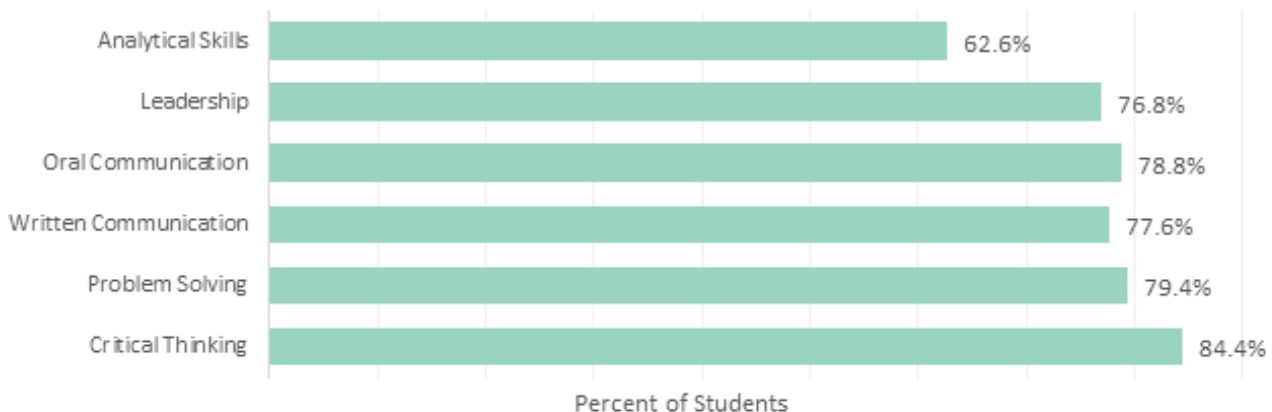
In 2014, NACE surveyed 606 representatives from various organizations. Respondents were asked to indicate the extent to which they view these competencies as essential to new college hire success when considering new college graduate candidates for their workplaces.

Here are the eight competencies and the percent of respondents that identified them as absolutely essential or essential.



WCCCD Graduate Exit Survey Results from 2018 – 2019 Survey

In the Graduate Exit Survey, students were asked to rate the degree to which their major program helped them in the following skill areas (see chart). In the 2018-2019 survey, majority of students rated these skills positively (meaning their major either helped them a great deal or quite a bit in these skill areas).

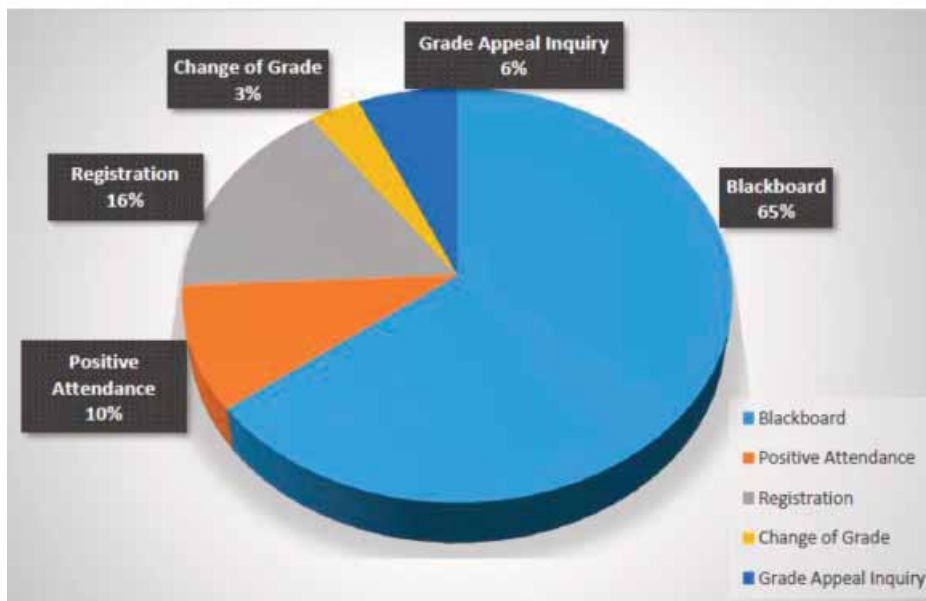

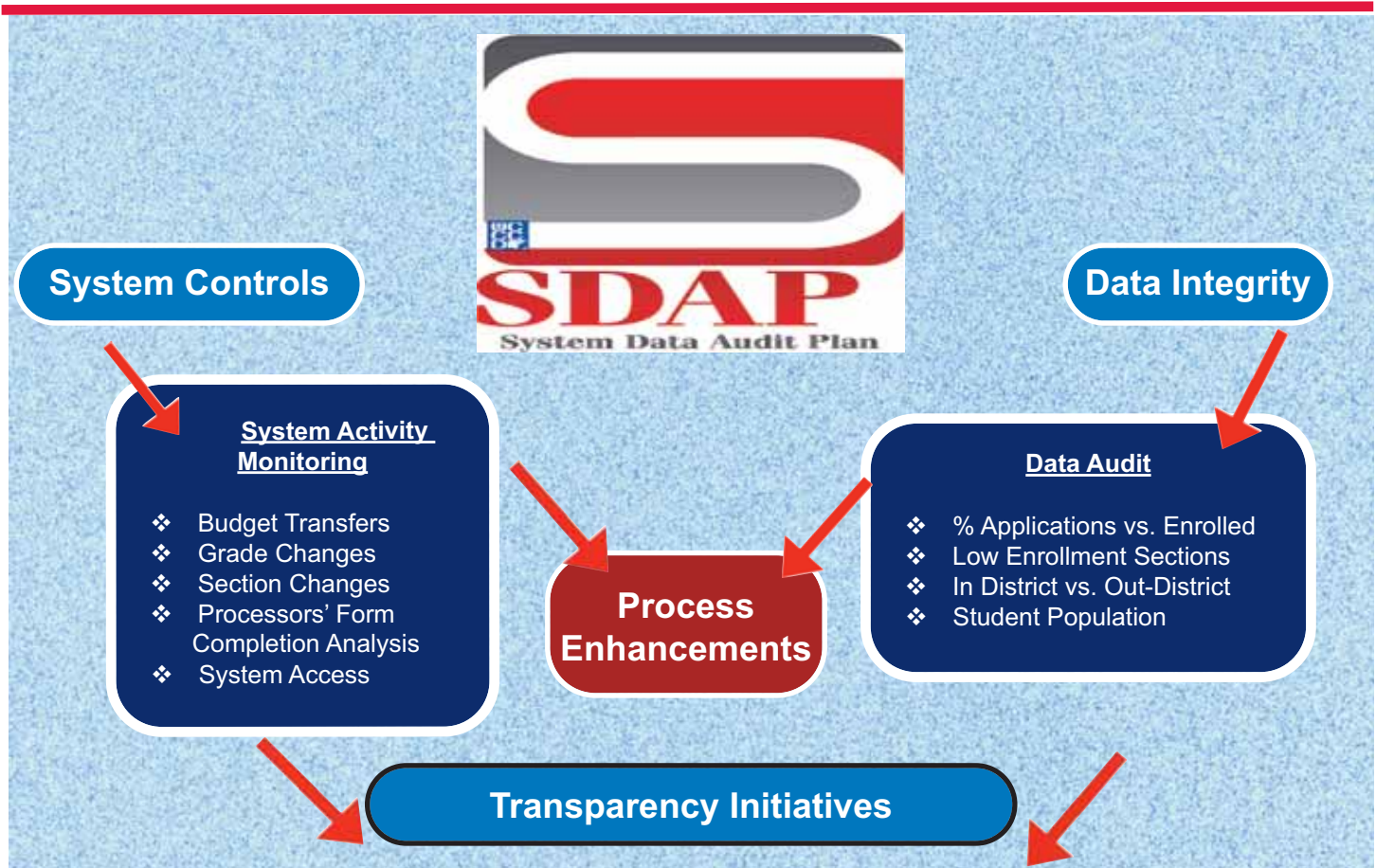

- Assessing internal controls and processes





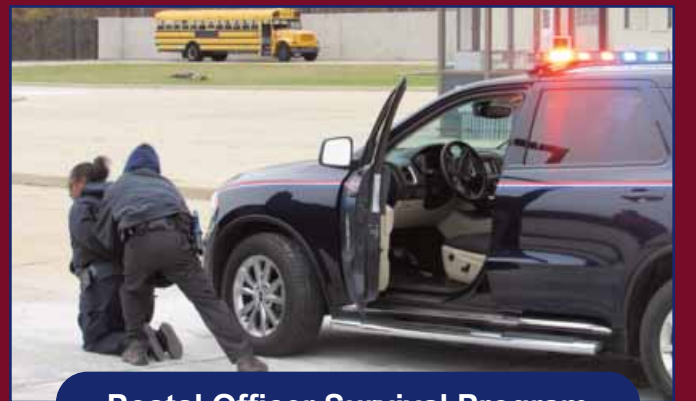

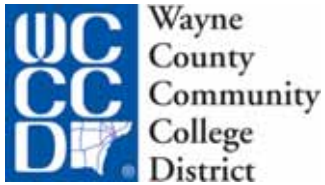
