


Student Executive Council's Food Pantry

In Fall 2014, Michigan community colleges and universities adopted the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) which allows students to transfer 30 credit hours of general education course work from college to the university. To achieve this goal, in Fall 2016, Michigan community colleges and universities established a statewide Transfer Steering Committee, with representatives from more than 30 colleges and universities to guide this work. WCCCD is represented on this steering committee which is now in the third phase of completion.

The Michigan Community College Association (MCCA) and its 28 member colleges and the Michigan Association of State Universities (MASU) and its 15 member universities have been working collaboratively to increase associate and bachelor's degree completion among transfer students from all backgrounds through collaboration among Michigan colleges and universities and engagement with faculty and higher education administrators.






Faculty Hotline: Commended for Customer Service








Health Benefit and Labor Update



Banner 9 Upgrade Project Weekly Update


