

Supporting the District's philosophy of continuous quality improvement, the Division of Student Services is facilitating a professional development series in order to ensure District-wide alignment of services.




Guided Pathways

Providing Individualized Support Services for Faculty





Academic Grade Appeals Procedure

The Academic Grade Appeal Process is a transparent method by which a student may challenge a final grade issued by an instructor. This process is the only method by which a student may challenge a final grade at WCCCD and affords students the necessary due process in addressing grade grievances. The academic catalog, student handbook and faculty handbook are a few sources for the policy and process outlined for the appeal of a final grade.


Veterans Administration Mental Health Summit










Skilled Trades-Construction


