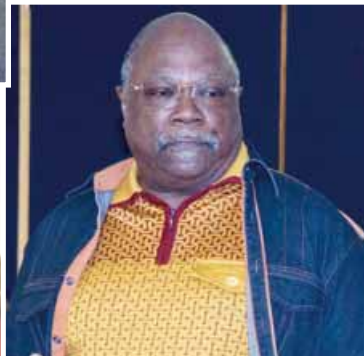

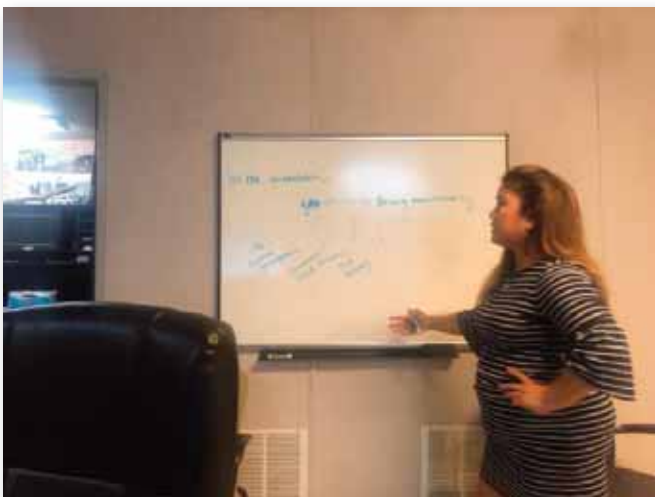
WCCCD/Fiat Chrysler Automotive Partnership

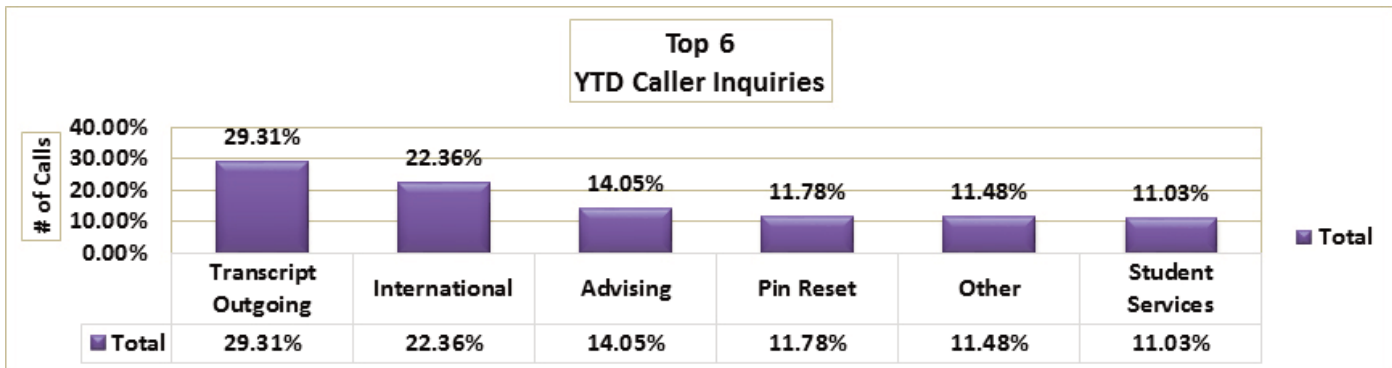

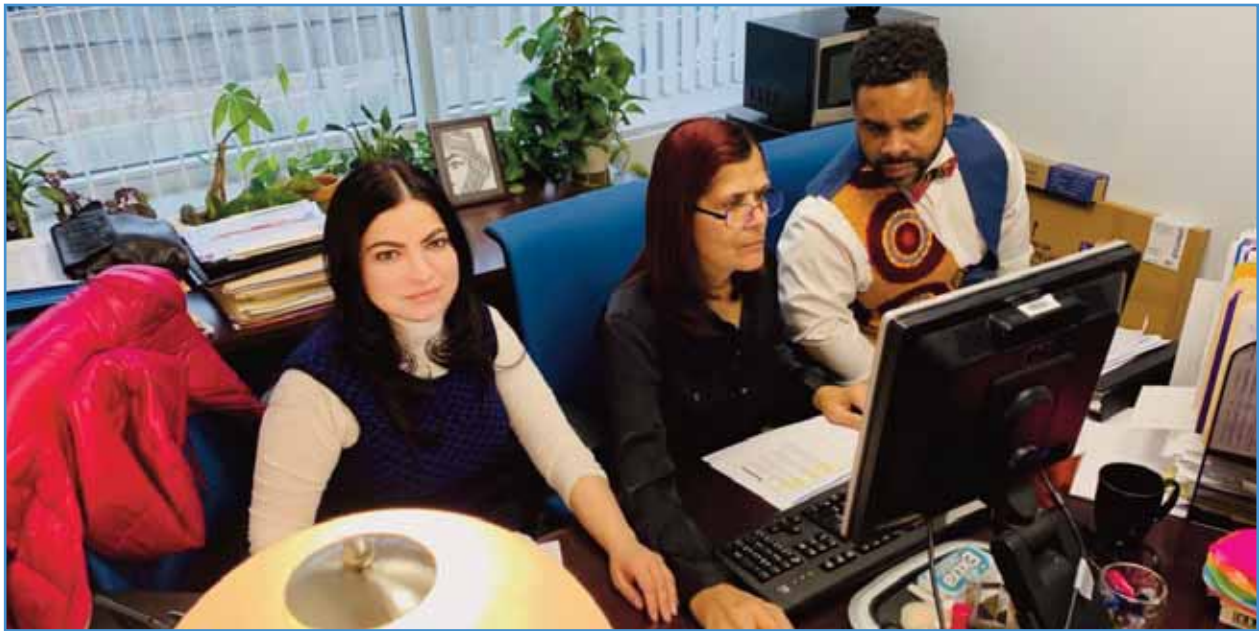

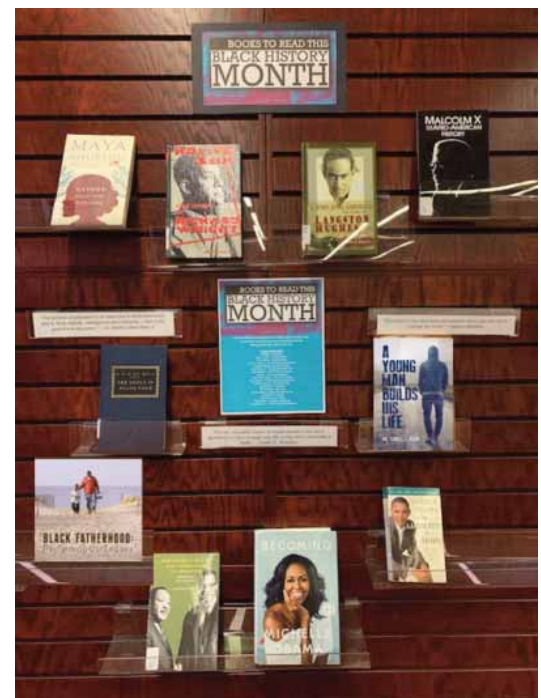


More Black History Month Programs

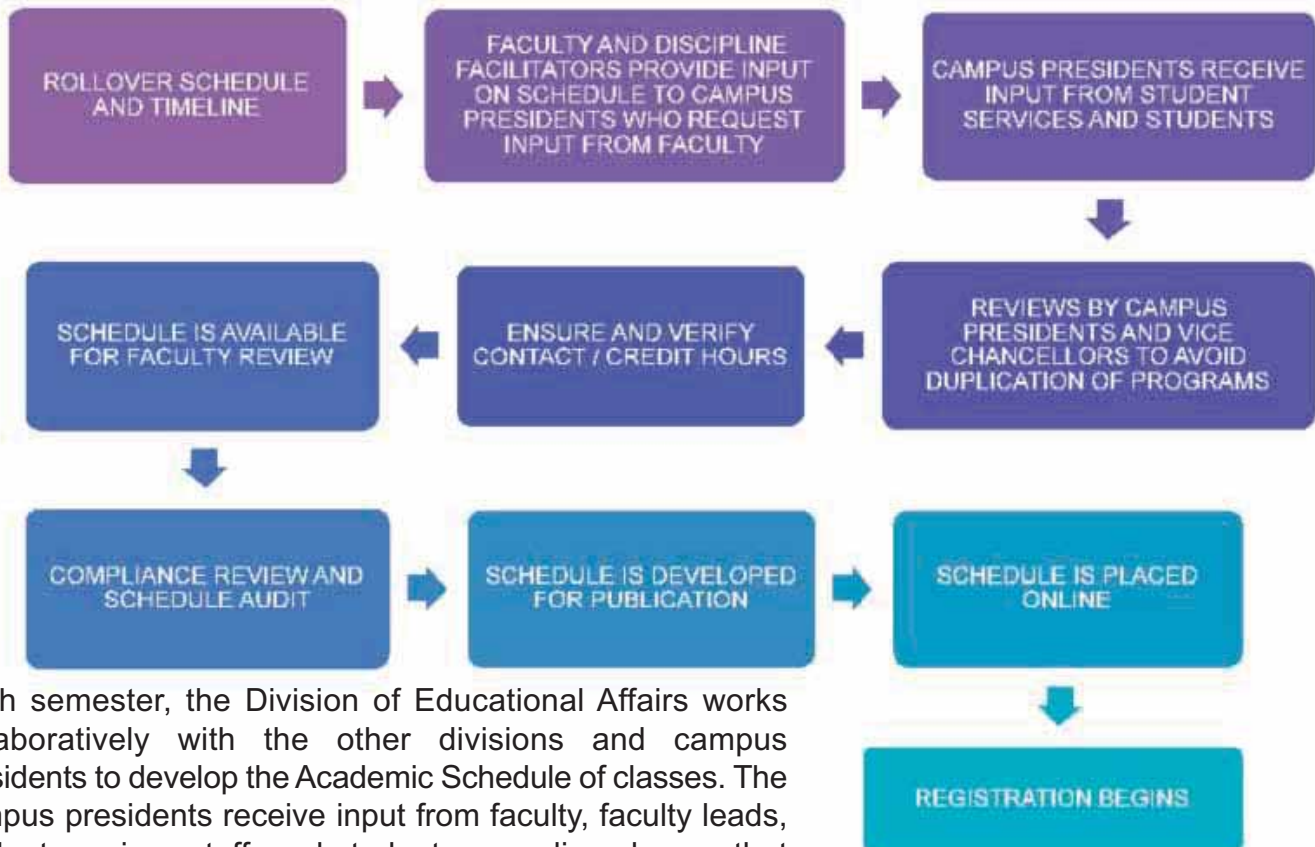

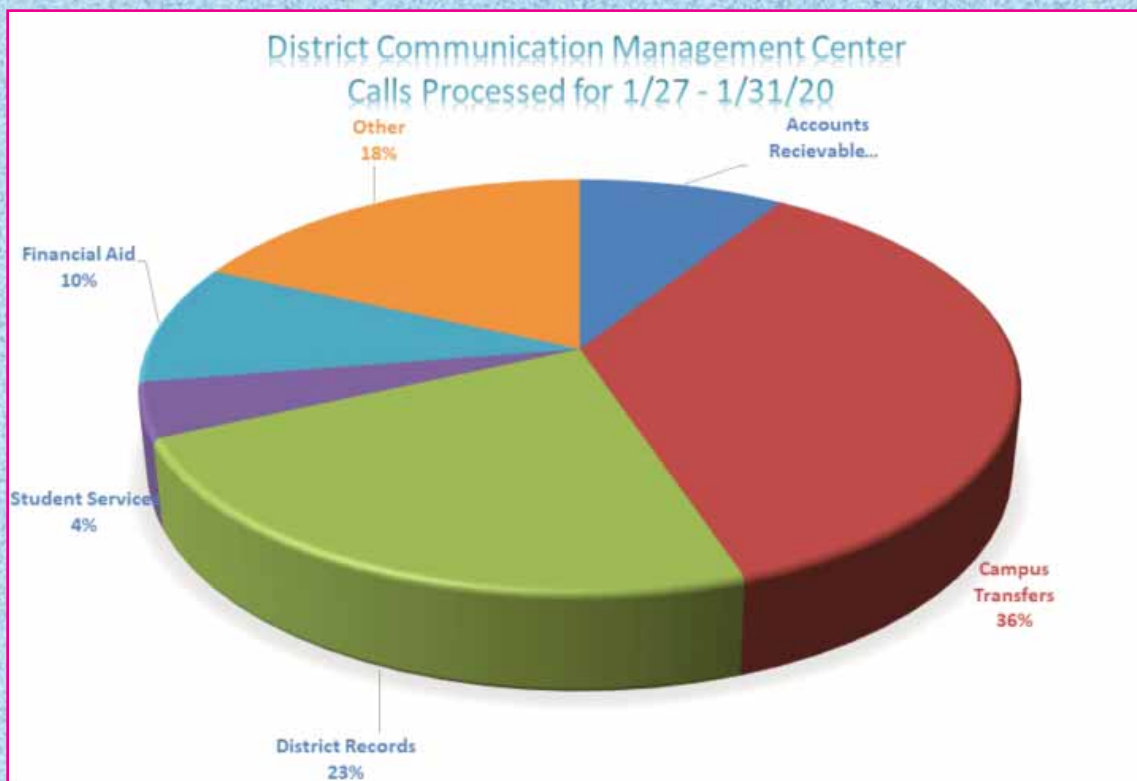

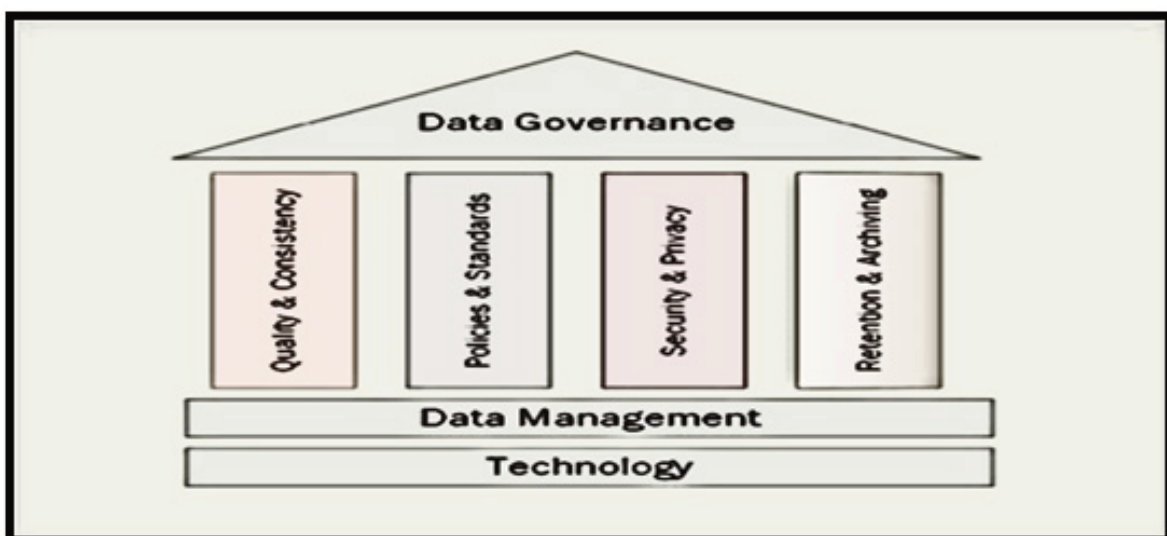


HR Data Integrity and Automation

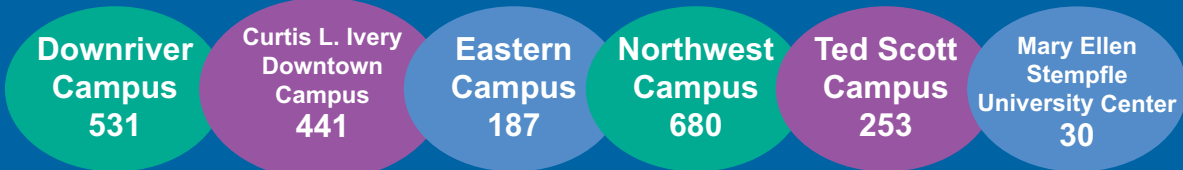

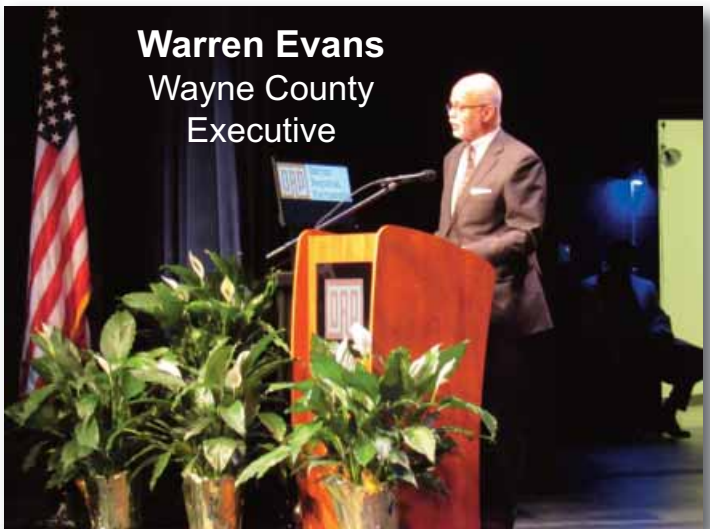

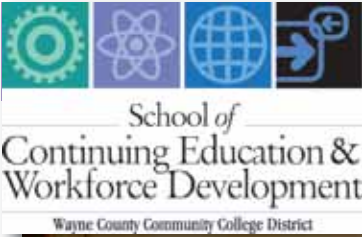
