





WCCCD defeated Mott Community College, #19 rank team in the country to move into second place in MCCAA conference.





# WCCCD Science Faculty Mentor Post-Doctoral Science Fellows for Spring 2020



The Website Redesign Taskforce met to finalize our vendor services proposal and to agree on best practice models from multi-campus community college districts for our website redesign.






# Detroit Wayne Integrated Health Network


