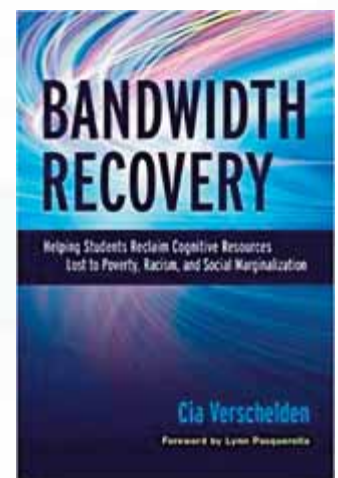
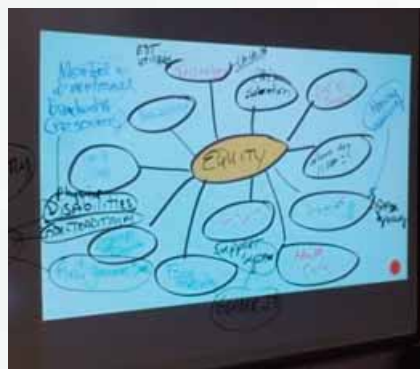

Cool Kids Code Partnership with Rainbow Push Coalition

Following a successful pilot collaboration between WCCCD and Rainbow Push Coalition, led by Reverend Jesse Jackson, the RTC's Cool Kids Code Program will now expand through a partnership with the NBA.

"Cool Kids Code," a three-week camp immersing inner city kids in a Silicon Valley-designed curriculum, was launched last summer in Detroit.

Partnering with WCCCD, the program's success with more than 250 youth laid the ground work to bring it to Chicago kids this summer and youth in Cleveland, Dallas and Milwaukee. Backing the initiative are sponsors like General Motors, Fiat Chrysler Automotive and Ford Motor Company.

WCCCD will facilitate the engagement of three other community college partners in the designated NBA cities.

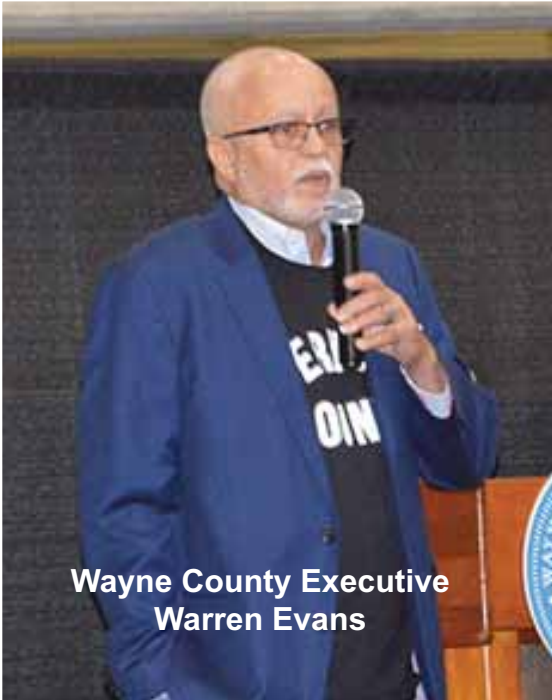

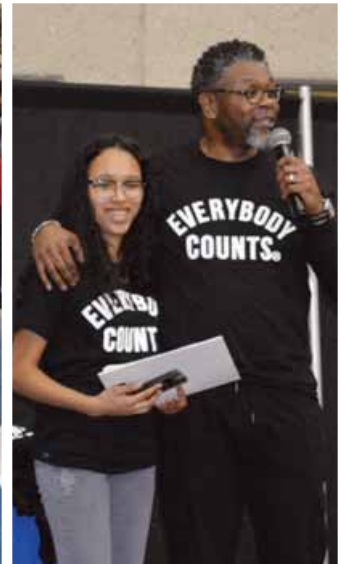


2020 Census and Voter Education Rally

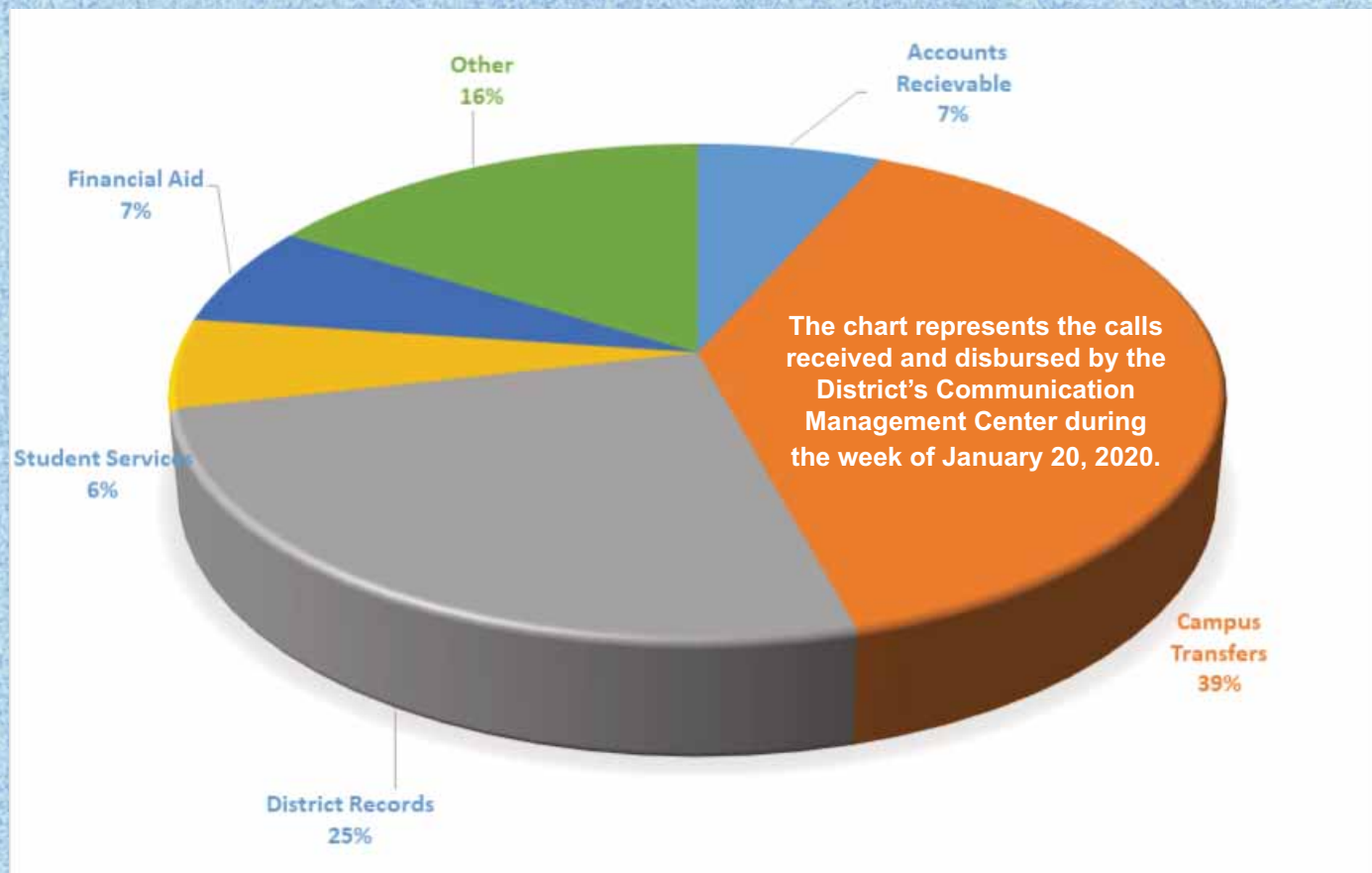

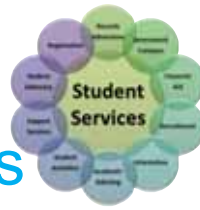

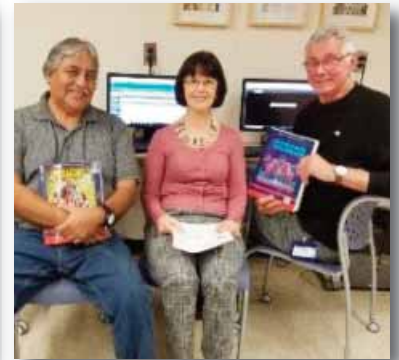
University Partnership Promotes Interest and Persistence in STEM

Share research assignments beforehand with librarians so that library orientations are focused and effective.

Attend library orientations with classes so as to emphasize the tours' importance.

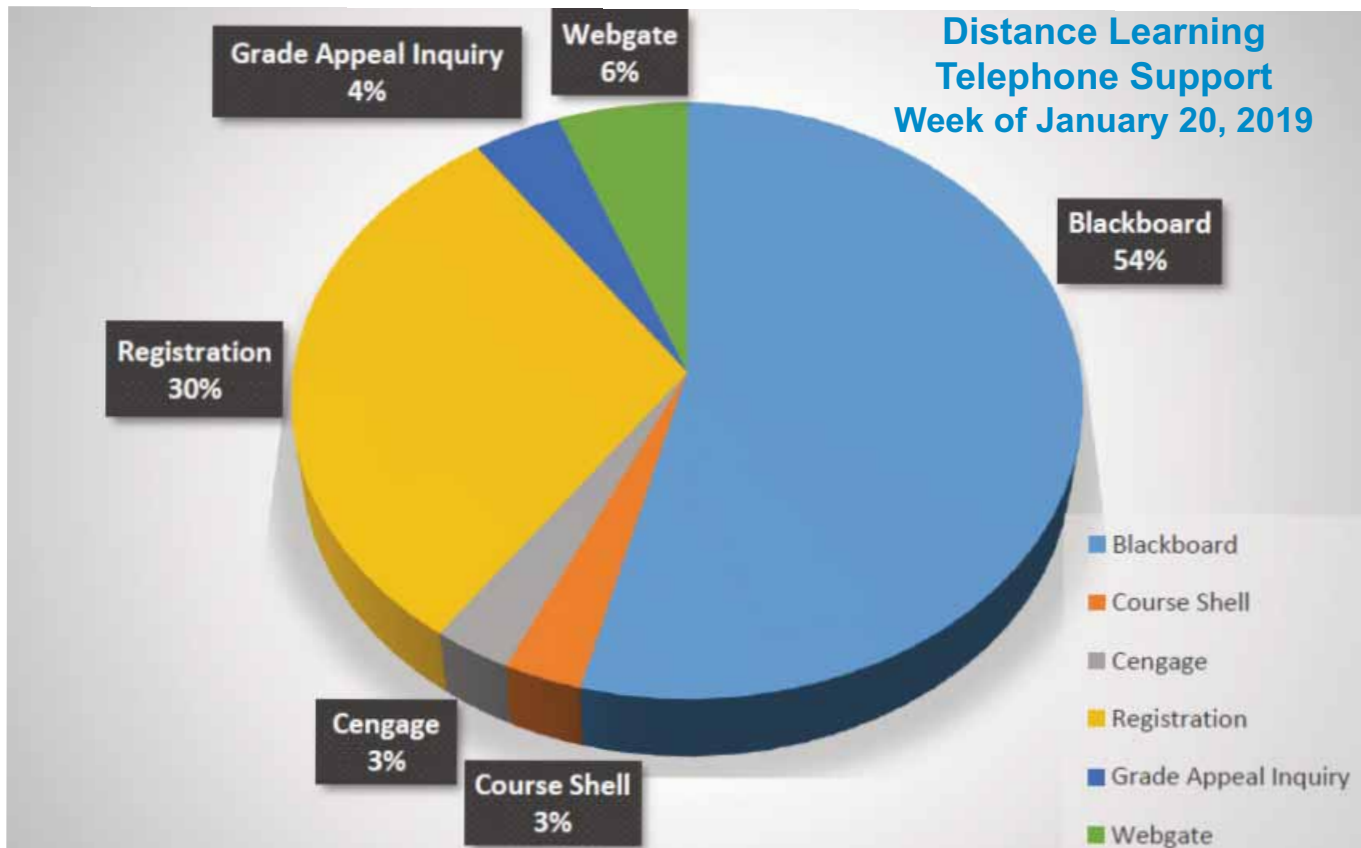
Distance Learning

- ❖ Student self-service



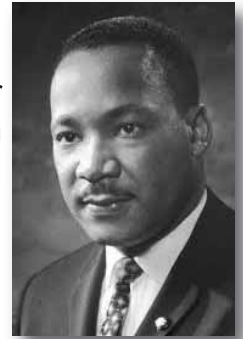

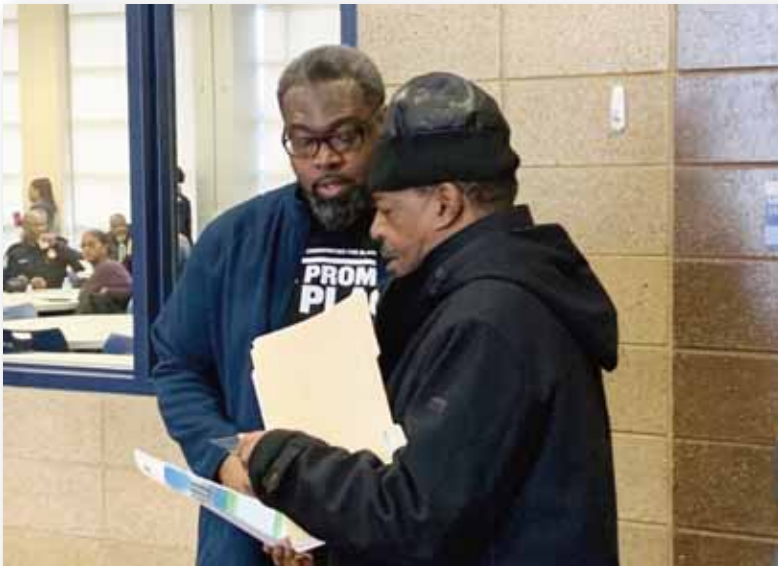
University of Michigan and Wayne State University were on campus to provide students with information regarding transfer opportunities once they graduate from WCCCD.
