

Commerical Driver's License Program

25% online, 75% outdoor and social distancing learning

Vehicles used for the CDL Program have been returned from inspection as Instructors record the pre-trip inspection video that will be used as a part of the online training instructional materials for the next cohort starting in July. Training begins next week with a roster of 15 students via Google Classroom. The first week of CDL Class A training will be entirely online. Students will learn driver's safety, vehicle inspection, the basics of shifting and what is expected as a commercial truck driver in industry settings prior to getting into the vehicles and shifting simulators at the Eastern Campus.





Horizontal Infrastructure Training Center

Staff from the Regional Training Center began planning for potential uses of the the 22 acre site of the old Northwest Campus for various outdoor and industry training program initiatives.



The Regional Training Center team met with the Detroit Talent Hub team and Brian McKinney, CEO Gayanga Co. to plan a new skill and apprenticeship training partnership in demolition, construction and heavy equipment operations. 








District Communication Management Center Calls Processed for 6/22 - 6/26/20




Leadership by Example Cultivating Responsible Practices for Everyday Norms

We received this note from one of Dr. Nancy Vieira Sterniak's students and I thought I would share it with you.



WCCCD Can Help Affect Cybersecurity

While COVID-19 has forced a large percentage of America to work from home, it also has provided more opportunities for exploration by evildoers affecting technology. "Over 90% of the penetrations of a computer are affected by something as simple as a phishing email," according to Mike McConnell, former director of the U.S. National Security Agency.

We know that technical skills and a STEM background are good foundations for a career in cybersecurity, but there are also opportunities for liberal arts graduates. They can "work with international malware trends and threat analysis, marketing, communication or government affairs," Leticia Gammill, of Cisco systems, reported in *Florida Trends, July, 2020.*

Cybersecurity companies are desperate for world-class talent, and community colleges have both an opportunity and an obligation to produce that talent. Women currently make up 24% of the cyber-security workforce worldwide, according to industry association data, and opportunities abound for graduates with diverse backgrounds. Industry experts now estimate up to 500,000 vacancies in cyber-security nationwide with \$80,000 + starting salaries, which creates more demand for degrees in this field to address the constantly growing threats.



Legislative Corner From the Michigan Community College Association

Senate Votes to Expand Dual Enrollment Eligibility

The Senate passed House Bills 4546 and 4547, both of which amend Michigan's dual enrollment laws. In addition to the original changes in the bills, which deal with the timing of eligible courses, MCCA staff were able to secure amendments to both bills that will allow students to use a GPA of 2.5 or higher, as an alternative to a qualifying score on an exam, to establish eligibility for dual enrollment during the coming year. This change was identified as important due to the delay in school-based SAT and PSAT administration from spring to fall this year, although K-12 school groups have pledged to have a deeper conversation about use of GPA as a qualifier in future school years as well.

Reimagining Workforce Preparation Grant Program

The Department of Education has announced the launch of the Reimagining WorkforcePreparation Grant Program, funded by the CARES Act. The grant program will provide \$127.5 million to states to expand educational opportunities through short-term, career pathways or sector-based education and training programs. Applications for the program opened on June 23, and the deadline to apply is August 24, 2020.
