


#### **Student Executive Council**

During registration, the Division of Student Services manages various student inquiries on a daily basis. The chart reflects the Top 7 Student Inquiries for 2020.






Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) Honor Society President Shawnta Ward is completing her last days leading PTK in April.




#### **New Career Programs**


## Learning Resource Center




Internationally renowned author and educator M. Dujon Johnson recently visited the District Police Authority to review the Clery Annual Security Report.

## News from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention... Coronavirus

WCCCD continues to monitor the public health situation related to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) and providing important information and updates to help you stay healthy. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends following daily preventative actions to help prevent the spread of respiratory diseases, including:

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth
- Stay home when you are sick
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.

Migrating to the cloud would allow for seamless scaling for new applications as well as a highly available environment. A pilot program will soon be underway to verify if this platform is a good fit for WCCCD.







