Congratulations to Kim DiCaro for leading a team including staff from WCCCD's Divisions of Workforce and Economic Development, Administration and Finance, and Information Technology, as well as the Detroit Talent Hub, WCCCD's third party intermediary. They completed the collaborative submission of a multimillion grant application for the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NITA), U.S. Department of Commerce's Connecting Minority Communities Pilot Program.

The grant will significantly boost the District's broadband and bridge the digital divide by connecting the community through enhanced Internet access, student success services and programs. This will build a consortium of learning providers and, establish a literacy and skill pipeline to increase training and job opportunities.

Letters of commitment were received from key partners including the city of Detroit Mayor's Office, Detroit Office of Digital Inclusion, Wayne State University, Connect 313, and employers Verizon Wireless and GDI Integrated Facility Services among stakeholders.

The new Horizontal Infrastructure Training Center Collaborative, a public-private partnership, will provide students with classroom instruction, insights and skills that will enable them to pursue a broad range of careers in construction technology, inspection, and testing. These fields are among the skilled trades reporting shortages in the availability of qualified workers.




Michigan College and University Partnership

He then broke into 3-D slide production which lead to animation at Boynton Film Studios. This led to hands-on production experience in stop-motion piece at Lucas Films in the special effect department. He currently works virtually with a producer at Wells Media Production on an over-the-internet production for Applied Materials in the San Francisco Bay area. He shares, "Technically-skilled art forced me to gain knowledge and different perspectives to resolve issues associated with a lack of technical background."

Professor Dryovage earned his Bachelor of Fine Arts and Master of Science in Game and Interactive Media Design and Simulation Animation Games from Eastern Michigan University. He also completed post-bachelor studies at De Anza College in video production and the College for Creative Studies (CCS), where he also teaches, in character animation. Professor Dryovage's accomplishments include successfully starting the International Interactive Communication Society (IICS) in the 1995-1998 era that brought to light the internet as application for business in the greater Detroit area, as well as building a strong following on LinkedIn.



- Never choose a password that includes personal information




Website Redesign Taskforce




Alzheimer's: Effective Communication Strategies Workshop




Pathways to Success: Enhancing Your Effective Listening Skills


