










- Optimizing existing content


This week, we reviewed the Current, Future, and International Students web pages. The anticipated launch of the newly designed website and implementation of the content management system is this summer.







DSS Functions - Guided Pathways


WCCCD women's basketball team won the home opener versus Schoolcraft College, while the Men came up short Friday in a loss vs. Schoolcraft Community College.



Employee Benefits Compliance Review





Where can I find my current pay stub?


To access your pay stub, please go to your employee Web-Gate, click on Pay Information, and select Pay Stub, which will allow you to review any previous pay period pay stubs.




Preparing for Virtual Faculty Selections






Office of Institutional Effectiveness

Future College Students' Perspectives

The Office of Institutional Effectiveness (IE) conducts environmental scans and analysis to inform planning efforts. Data collected on trends in higher education and majors inform improvements of programs and services offered to students. A recent study by the Third Way advocacy group, shows how the COVID-19 pandemic has dramatically altered the higher education landscape as measured by students' perspectives. The study entitled: One Semester Later: How Prospective and Current College Students' Perspectives of Higher Ed Have Changed between August and December 2020, shows that students, including high school seniors are paying attention to the price of higher education and its response to the pandemic.

According to the study, collegebound high school seniors are signaling that the current state of affairs clouds their perceptions on the value of college. Additional perceptions of the surveyed high school students are indicated to the right.










Other Significant WCCCD Student Demographics **Compared to National Data**








