


Fall 2021 Schedule Development

Learning Resource Centers





The data indicates as expected, a decrease in face-to-face Learning Resources Center (LRC) circulation utilization driven by the physical restriction from COVID-19 that would combine with correlating increase in the use of new and/or expanded virtual LRC services.



Early Childhood Education



The Division of Institutional Effectiveness (IE) reviewed national research trends to assist divisions, programs, and the District with planning initiatives. 






District Communication


Character Always Rules

We have all heard countless stories and seen many examples of individuals who work very hard and produce acceptable results, but something is just not quite right with their performance. It is also often said that the toughest, most difficult issues that leaders have to deal with are personnel or human resources issues. Very often those challenges deal with matters of character.




