PBI \$1.9 Million Five-Year Department of Education grant awarded!

A team consisting of Kim DiCaro, Denise Shannon, Furquan Ahmed, Robert Palmer, Johnesa Hodge, James Robinson, Glenda Wapeangan-Magarrell and Mary Ann Troy received an award letter marking five years of support (2021-2025) for delivering comprehensive skilled workforce training, credentials, academic, and non-academic education.

#### Michigan Department of Transportation awards an initial \$50,000 grant!

This grant will support the Outdoor Horizontal Infrastructure Training Center's Civil Technology and Testing Program that will launch with a bootcamp in October 2021 and academic programs in 2022.

#### \$400,000 Kellogg Foundation grant!

This grant will support the Outdoor Horizontal Infrastructure Training Center programs. Funding includes site improvements and targets skill training completion, credentialing and hiring for 80 students.

#### \$400,000 Grant Awarded by the PepsiCo Uplift Foundation!

This grant will support student success in high-growth industries through the WCCCD Scholarship Committee. This grant will provide scholarships for tuition and career planning support for underrepresented students interested in careers in STEM, Business, Computer Information Systems, and Trucking/Logistics.


We met this week to discuss the new centralized Learning Resource Center and Regional Learning Commons opening for the Fall 2021 semester.



## Student Activities, Clubs and Organizations









# The School of Continuing Education


