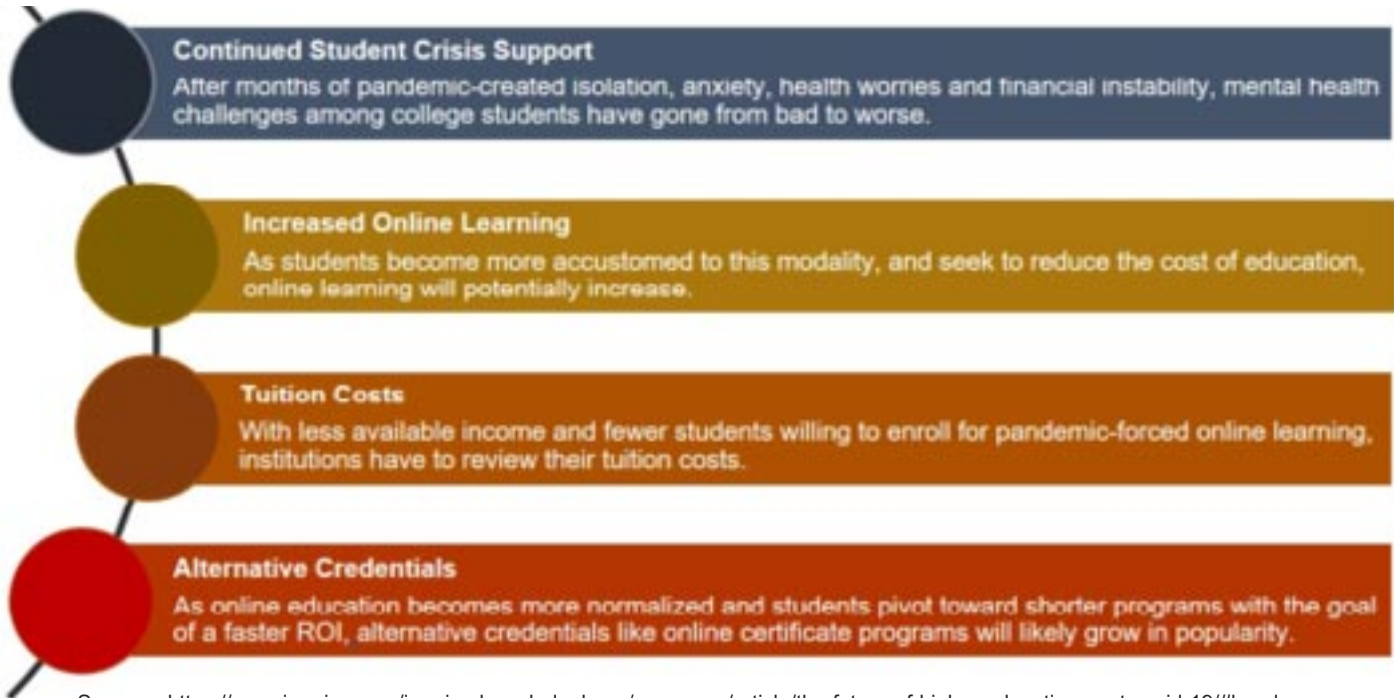

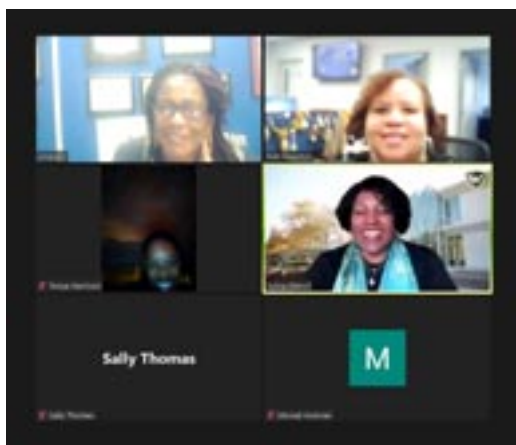

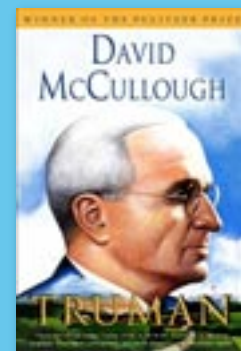


BALANCE IS THE KEY TO A GOOD LIFE
