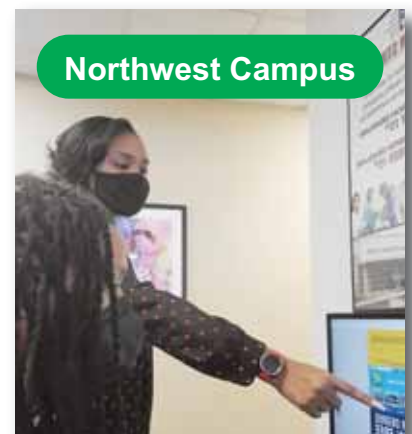
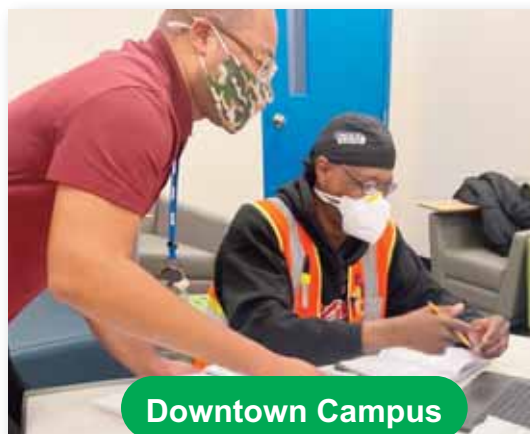


Help Desk Technical Support Dashboard – Spring 2022

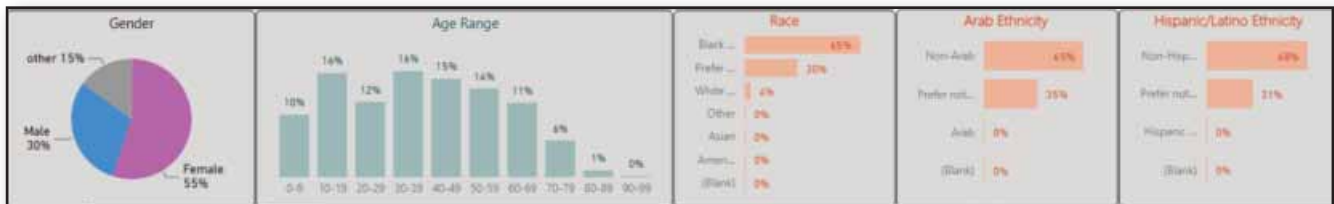

Construction Trades Training Program

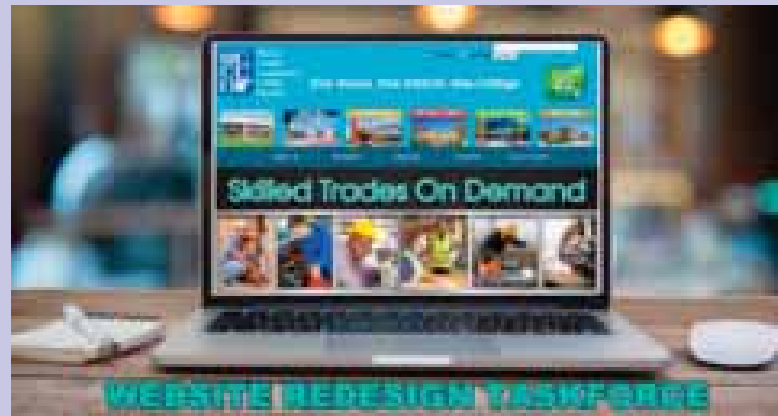

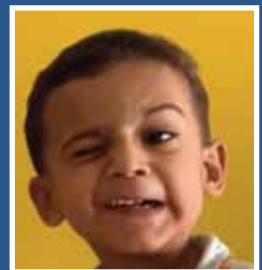


Website Redesign Taskforce
