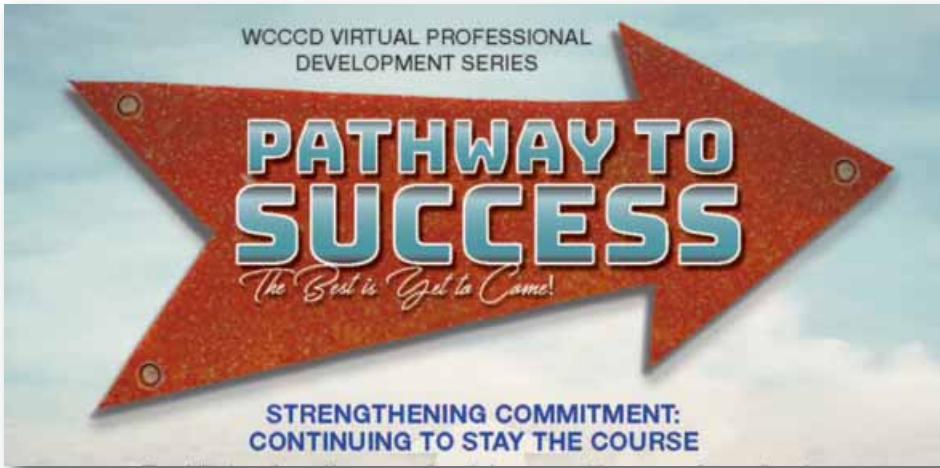

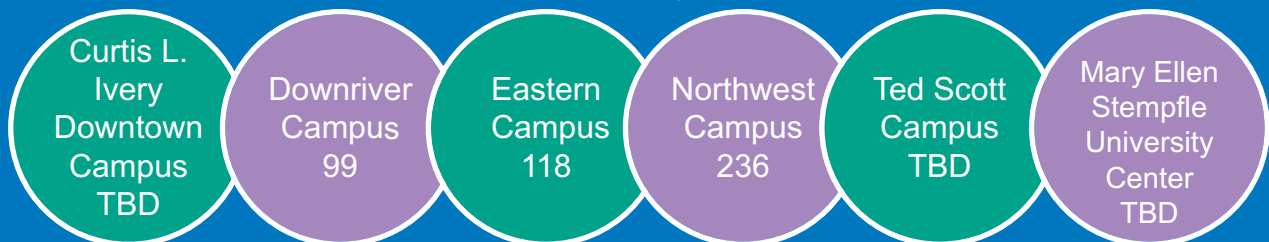

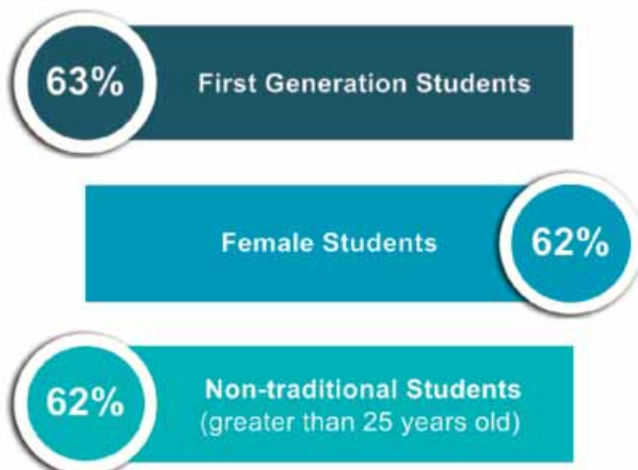
Top business occupations projected to have the most openings each year, on average, and their current median wage

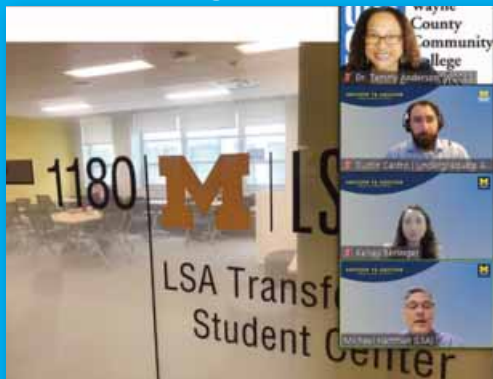

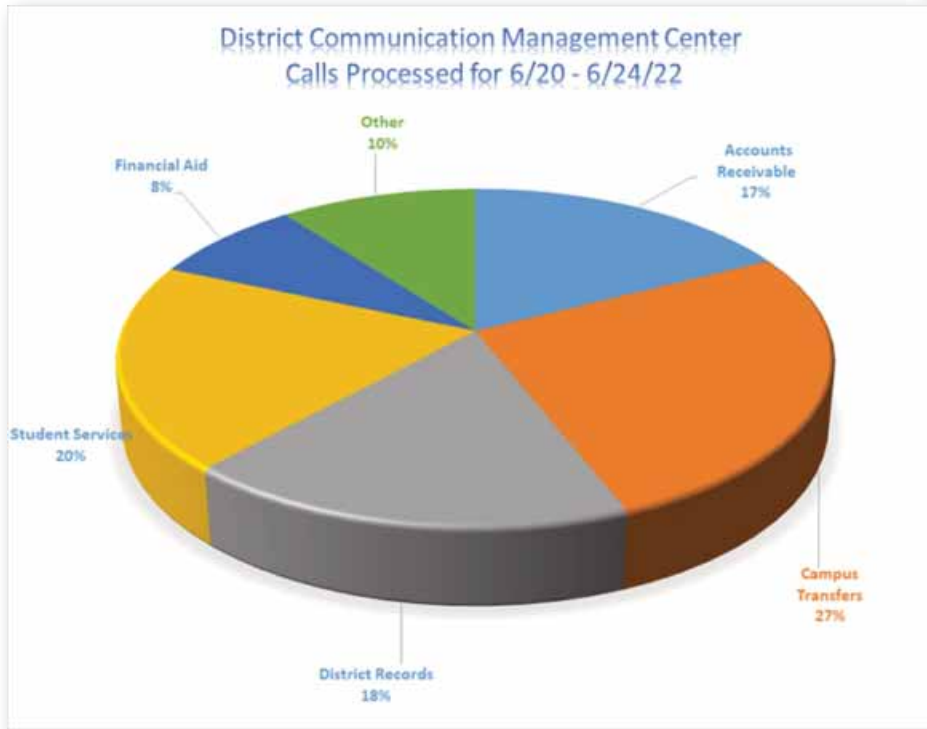
Staff continue to review new international student applications to ensure required documents are collected.

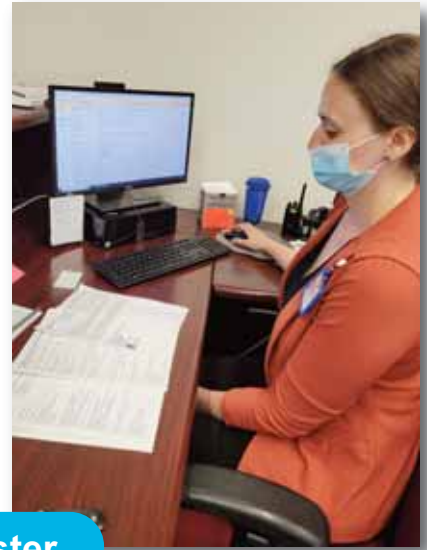

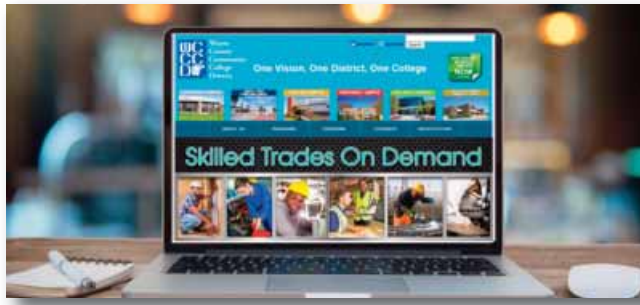

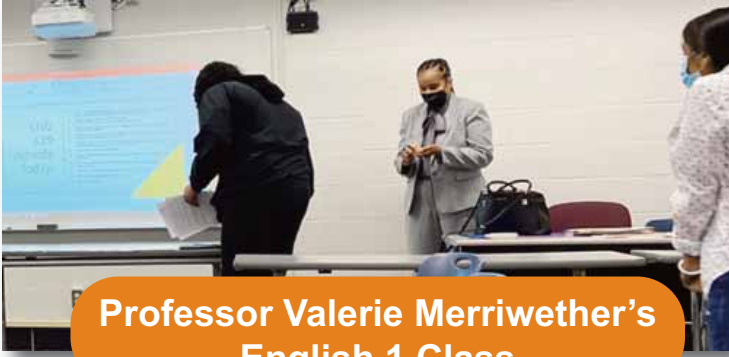
