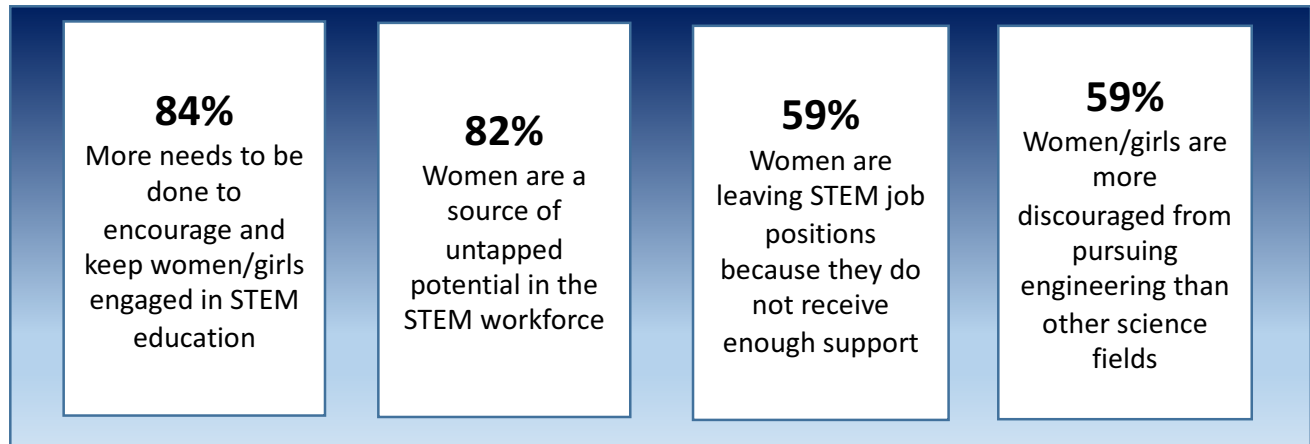

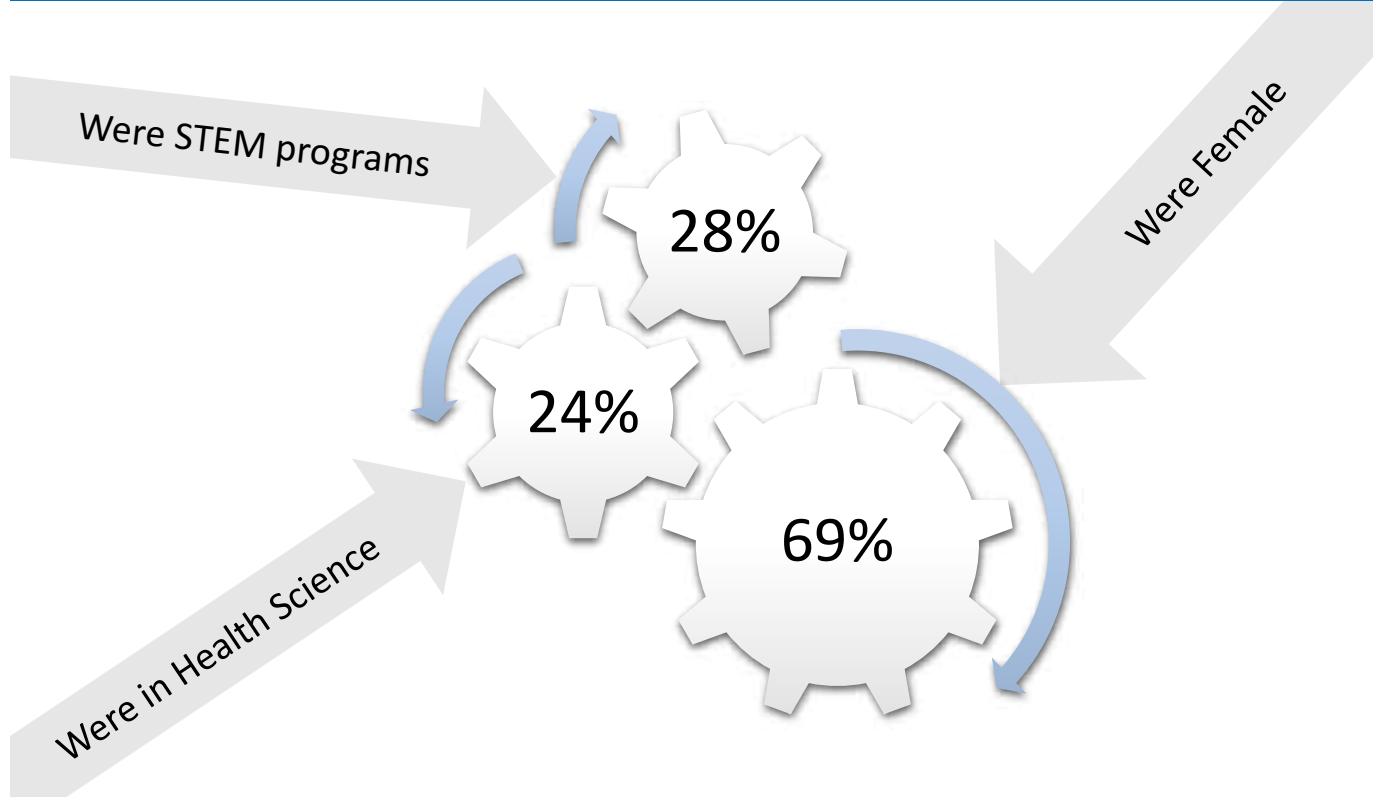
What's Trending – STEM Equity

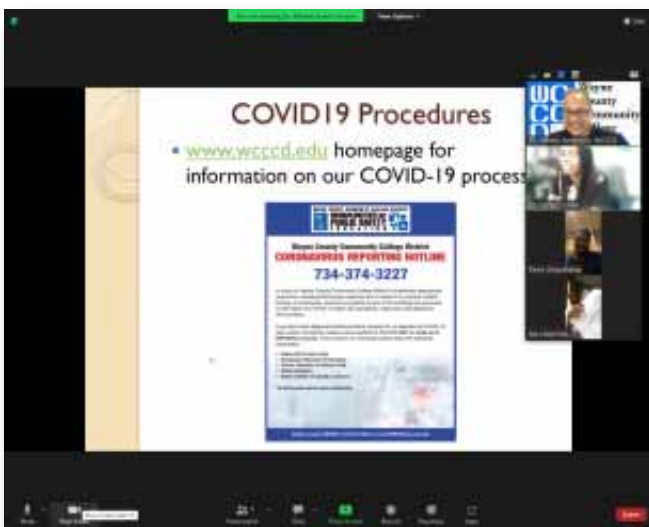

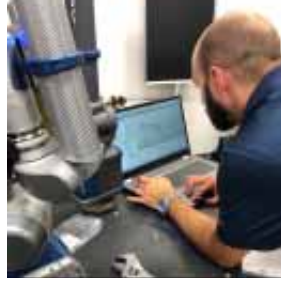

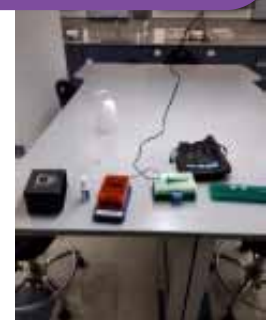
