


## Virtual Intercultural Conversations





#### 82%


of manufacturing executives surveyed said they expect to invest more in cybersecurity in 2022

The team also met to review resource apps for students, faculty, and staff visiting the LRC's. Innovative apps will allow students access to a variety of online technology programs to complement instruction.






#### **DEVELOPING INNER STRENGTH**

Renowned psychologist Mihaly Csikszentmihalyi calls this rare experience 'flow.' Steve Magness notes in *Do Hard Things*, that you are achieving flow when "ego falls away- every action flows from the previous action, and you are using your skills to the utmost." Today we commonly refer to this as 'being in the zone.'

Being able to perform at one's utmost level of skill can have a lot to do with one's environment. When leaders and bosses set a tone for belonging and making progress, they can greatly enhance performance and a sense of life-balance. Working in a positive, supportive environment fosters a sense of psychological safety where it is okay to take risks to improve.

Ultimately, we can develop inner strength by "embracing our reality, being secure in who we are, and fulfilling our basic human needs." As we learn to embrace our feelings and emotions, we are much more likely to find meaning and purpose in life as we meet life's challenges.


