


WCCCD Nursing Pinning Ceremony May 13, 2022




Near Completers Initiative



Coming this Fall 2022


Beginning Fall 2022, WCCCD will enter into a new partnership with Follett ACCESS that allows students to access and purchase their course materials online. This program will simplify the process for students by getting all of their required materials ordered online. Additional benefits will be a substantial cost savings for digital course materials compared to the national retail costs for the same products. In addition, a pilot program will also be launched for 10 courses, that will allow students to purchase digital course materials within the Black Board environment.

Mr. Cosma also met with Dennis Beste from Western Governor University regarding career pathways in the field of education.







What's Trending: Some College, No Credential (SCNC) Student Outcomes



Evaluating Performance

While it is often uncomfortable to evaluate the performance of others, the success of any organization depends upon having a talented team that can achieve effective results. "If someone is doing their job poorly, consider whether it is due to inadequate learning or inadequate ability," notes Ray Dalio in *Principles*. A weakness or substandard performance that is due to a lack of experience or training can be addressed and fixed. However, shortcomings due to a lack of ability are far more serious, and they generally cannot be fixed. It is important for leaders to understand the difference between these two factors so the desired outcome can be achieved. This is also where the importance of staff development comes into play. Properly targeted and with good planning, staff development can go a long way towards improving employees' performance.
