





The Federal Work-Study Program (FWS) continues to assist our students, educating them on the FWS Program's process and procedures. Students are proactively completing applications for Spring 2023.











What's Trending: Self-Employment



Sample demographics from Wayne County Community College District's Entrepreneurship Program






Dr. CharMaine Hines participated in the AACC's Fall Commission convening as a member of one of nine commissions.






