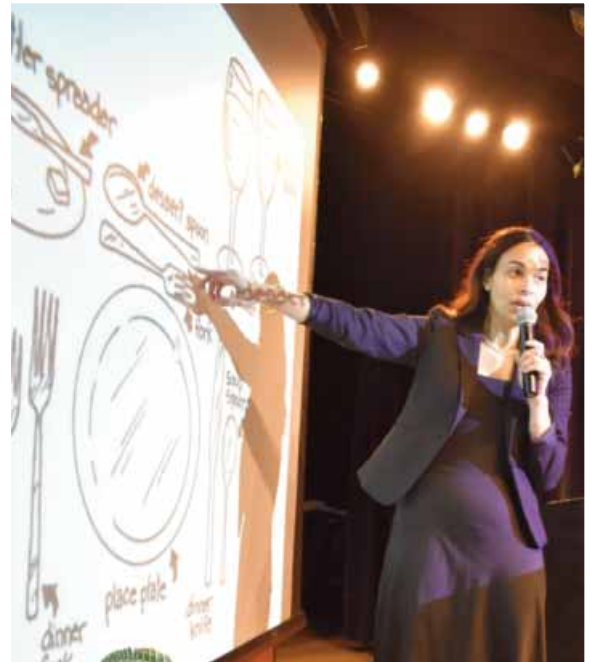

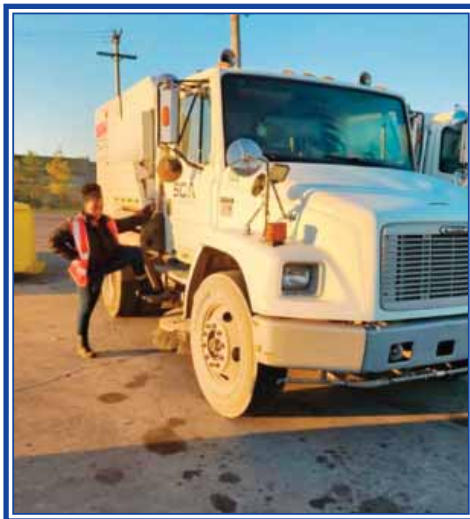


# Division of Workforce and Economic Development

## Shelby Stoll ~ Welding Technology



### How I fell in love with the discipline:

I originally got into welding while working in automotive education and immediately felt drawn to it. To me, welding is a physical representation of art and music (my other passions), and once I was exposed to it everything clicked into place.

### Education:

I graduated from a Welding and Fabrication Program in 2016, along with an A.A.S. in Technological Sciences as a Welding Major. I went on to achieve my American Welding Society QC10 Certification, and have since received various welding certifications through the National Coalition of Certification Centers (NC3).

### What are you most excited about in the upcoming semester regarding your course(s)?

The District has purchased all new multi-process welders for our welding lab. I am looking forward to diving in and getting to play with the new equipment, and very excited to give students valuable exposure to new technology.

### Three things people may not know about me:

1. I love being able to represent women in industry and be an example that you can love makeup, nails, etc., and still be a fantastic welder.
2. I've been playing piano since I was 6 years old.
3. My original career path was in Fine Arts, which I also have a degree in.

### How long have you been at WCCCD?

This is my first semester here, and I am having a blast with my great group of students!

### How would students describe your teaching style?

I think they would describe me as laid-back and experimental. I love trying outside-the-box techniques, and encourage my students to “beta test” to better understand the “why’s” instead of just the “how’s.” Failure is a great tool for understanding the science of welding.

My faculty mentors, Cameron Berrier and Lawrence Battis have been instrumental in my success with welding and education. I cannot thank them enough for their guidance and support!

Nadia Azzam was the guest speaker at this week's session. Ms. Azzam provided staff with important information about services for our international students.



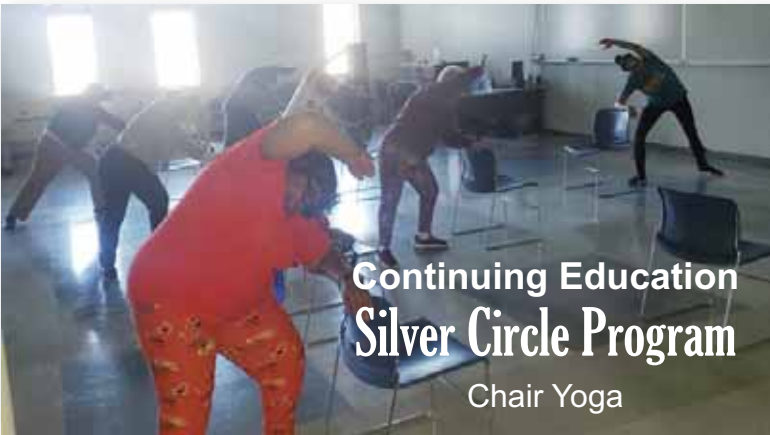
