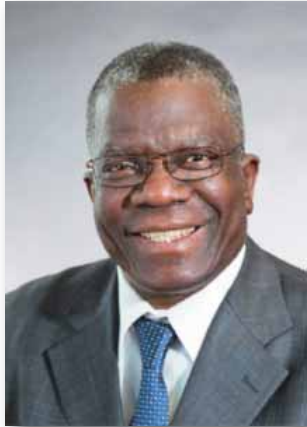

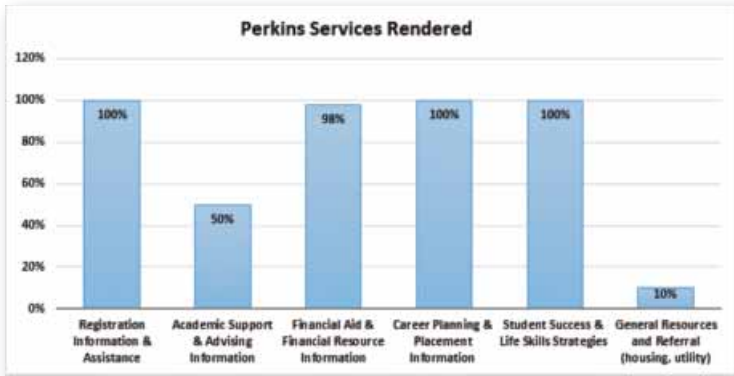

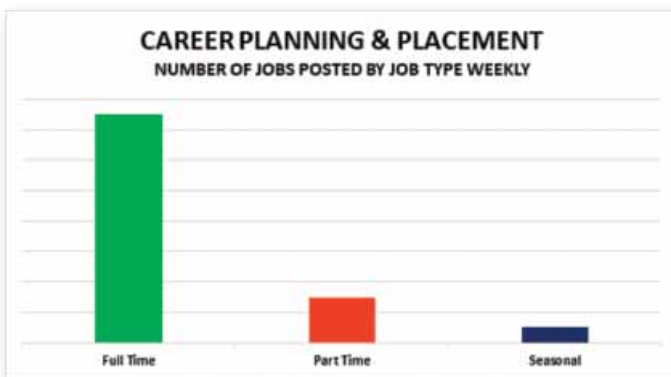

According to an article in the Nurse Journal entitled, “**Best-Paying Nursing Jobs With an Associate Degree in Nursing,**” indicated that one of the fastest ways to become a registered nurse (RN) is by pursuing an associate degree in nursing (ADN). Below you will find some sample data points from the article:

What Jobs Can You Get With a Nursing Associate Degree?	Median Salary
Registered Nurse - provides general patient care	\$75,330
Oncology Nurse - works with terminally ill patients	\$75,050
Emergency Room Nurse - works with triage patients	\$69,960
Home Care Nurse - works in the homes of chronically ill patients	\$65,110
Pediatric Nurse - care for children across the age span into adolescence	\$63,000

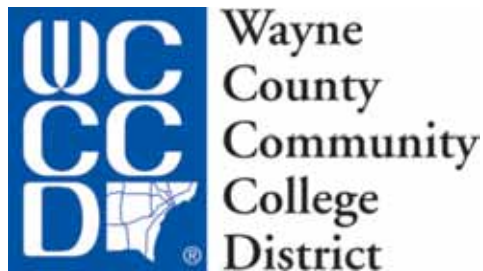
