#### **Regional Training Center Upate**



Members of the Career Planning and Placement team met to discuss final draft options for the new design on the College Central Network site.






Students continue to utilize the food and hygiene products available in the food pantry. They must call the Division of Student Services to arrange a time to visit the food pantry.


#### Program Spotlight: Certified Nursing Assistant

The Office of Institutional Effectiveness (IE) reviews national data to support the district with program offerings and service. According to the US Bureau of Labor Statistics overall employment of nursing assistants and orderlies is projected to grow 8 percent from 2020 to 2030, about as fast as the average for all occupations. Nursing assistants held about 1.4 million jobs in 2020. The largest employers of nursing assistants were as follows:
