

WCCCD's New Mechatronics Cell Goes "LIVE!"







FINANCIAL AID

President Joe Biden formally signed the year-end omnibus package into law, staving off a government shutdown and completing the budget cycle for fiscal year 2023. The law, signed on December 29, 2022, allocates \$79.6 billion to the Department of Education and its programs, a \$3.2 billion boost from the fiscal year (FY) 2022 enacted level. Specifically, the spending package contains \$24.6 billion for federal student aid programs, including a \$500 increase to the maximum Pell Grant award, bringing the total to \$7,395 for the 2023-24 award year.


