
WCCCD has welcomed new military veteran students for the Spring 2023 semester. Many are using Post 911 GI Bill benefits which pays for tuition and fees.

TRiO student Emily Whitney donated her English textbook to the TRiO Office. Donated books are loaned out to TRiO students.




TRiO student Todd Jackson, the first in his family to earn a college degree, is excited about his graduation!


Implementation Activation Convening
