Staff continue to assist our international students with admissions and registration.



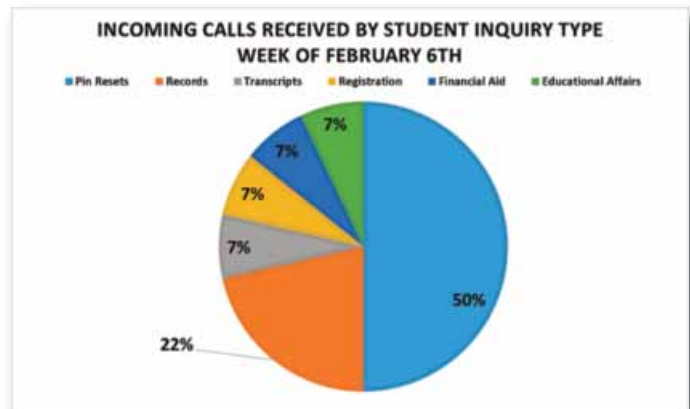

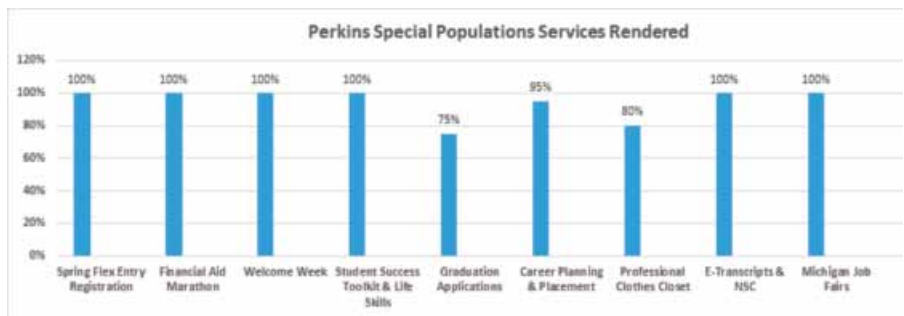


## Phi Theta Kappa (PTK)

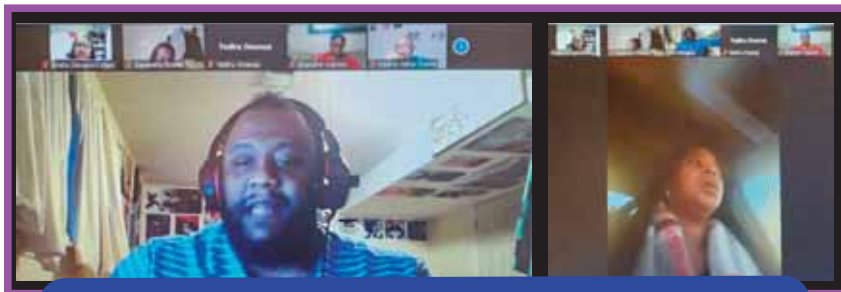

## **Mission**

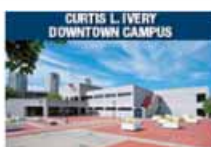
