


The Division of Student Services held orientations to assist students in-person and virtually in completing their application for the Summer and Fall 2024 semesters.

#### IE collaborates with Health Sciences



Staff met with the Nursing Department to discuss data required to complete their Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN) Report.

IE has reviewed over 500 student records with the Nursing Department since spring 2018.

According to the American Association of Community Colleges (AACC), "Community colleges are crucial to mitigating nursing shortages." Additionally, the article indicates that the pandemic has contributed to nursing staff shortages due to employee burnout and retirements. Below are some points from the article:

The nursing workforce is aging. The National Council of State Boards of Nursing reported the average age of registered nurses is 52.

Nursing Shortage

Millions of registered nurses are expected to leave the profession by 2030. The U.S. will need a minimum of 1.2 million new nurses to meet need.

Over the past three years, WCCCD has graduated more than 200 nursing students. IE labor market analysis suggests we will continue to experience a 24.2% increase in "nursing processes" in Wayne County, MI. There are more than 350 employers hiring for registered nurses in Wayne County, MI.

The Division of Educational Affairs has completed faculty evaluations for the Spring 2024 semester.


In a recent article in the *Journal of English Language Teaching, Linguistics, and Literature*, three major aspects of teaching effectiveness were tied to student learning:

The Ted Scott Campus hosted the Michigan Fly Fishing Club New Member Workshop. Participants attended a series of classes covering every aspect of fly fishing.










