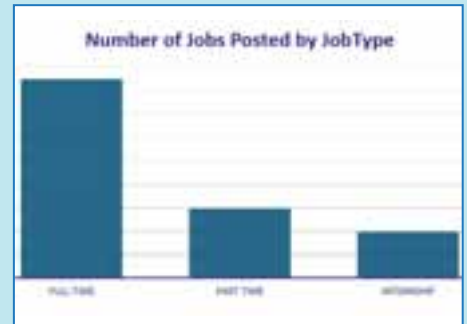
International Students

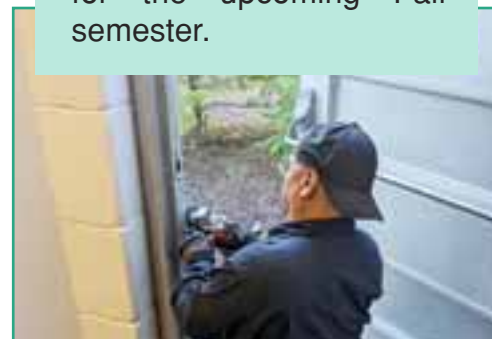

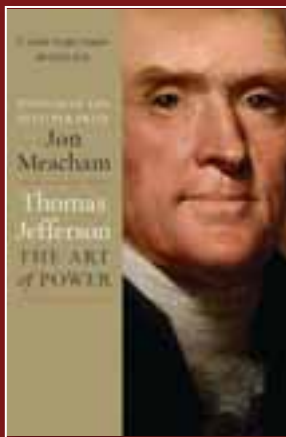


ENDURING STRATEGIES FOR SUCCESS
