






## Phi Theta Kappa




#### Division of Educational Affairs



Trustee Sharon P. Scott, along with staff from the Ted Scott and Downriver campuses, attended the Westland Foundation's Christmas in July event.





Students participated in a class on Mango software at the Language Institute.








#### **Community Partnerships**


