
Leadership is the Ability to Influence Others

There are many reasons people choose not be become leaders, and chief among those reasons is it means being responsible and accountable. Not everyone wants to be responsible and accountable. There are countless authors and books defining leadership, and John C. Maxwell has done an excellent job of providing simple concepts based upon his wealth of experiences in *Developing the Leader Within You 2.0.*

Maxwell lays out ten essential concepts for developing yourself as a leader, and the most important of those is influence. His humorous and favorite leadership proverb is "He who thinketh he leadeth and hath no one following him is only taking a walk." If leadership is the ability to obtain followers, then we must realize that leadership is not always for good.

If you mistakenly define leadership as the ability to achieve a position of authority rather than the ability to attract followers, you are likely to become a failed leader. This is true in higher education, in the public sector, and in the private sector because the basic principles of leadership apply to any organization.
