






Career Pathway Institute Collaboration With Schoolcraft College



Eastside Advisory Council






Participants in the South Asian Cultural Association Meeting discussed the lifestyles of south Asians in the U.S., including family traditions, and the impact of differences among various generations.





The team met with students from Davis Aerospace to discuss program offerings and enrollment for the Spring 2025 semester.






Beta Beta Beta National Biological Honor Society
