

- · Cultivating resilience and self-confidence through immersive, real-world experiences.











# WCCCD Criminal Justice Externship at the University of Michigan



# **Empowering Students: The Role of Student Ambassadors in Resource Awareness**
























# Michigan College and University Partnership—MiCUP

## **Benefit Programs Compliance Review**


The Division of Human Resources is currently reviewing and reconciling its process and procedures for employee tuition assistance/waiver and reimbursement.


